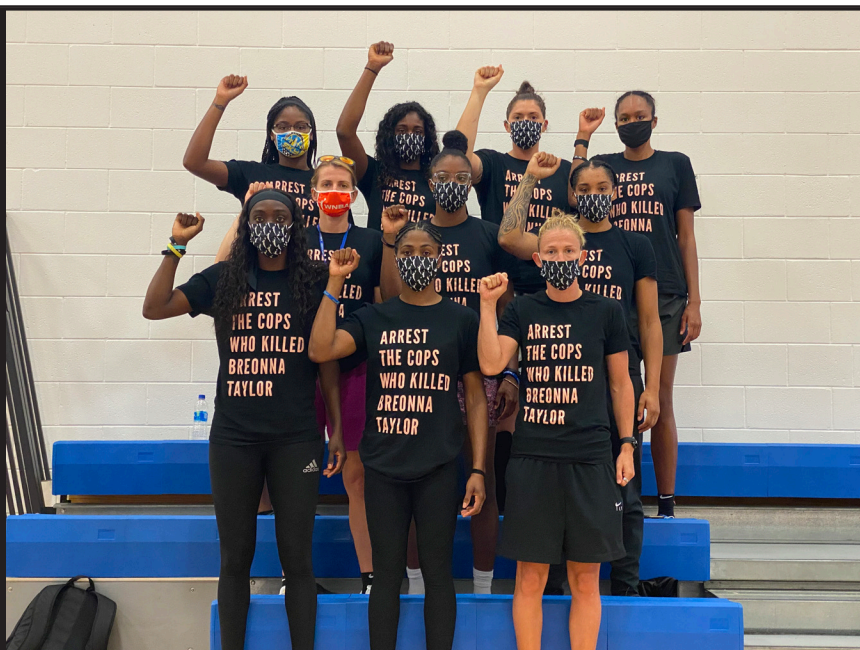

Chicago Sky players will donate \$10 for every point scored, \$100 for every win, and \$50 for any loss throughout the 2020 WNBA season under a social justice initiative called #SkyTakesAction.

"#SkyTakesAction is about longevity and community," Gabby Williams said. "It's about inspiring others and teaching everyone that it doesn't take much to change someone's life, or improve somebody's situation as long as we work together. Of course, our goal is to raise absolutely as much money as possible for the organizations we've chosen. But it's also about education and changing the norm. Hopefully this will inspire and teach our fans and those who hear us to increase their level of involvement in the community."

Fans have answered Williams' call to show support by raising **\$10,740** in five weeks of fundraising through Athletes For Justice. The Sky as a team has donated **\$15,170** through its total points, 10 wins and six losses this season. The combined total currently is **\$26,450**.

In addition, Sky owner Michael Alter, minority owner John Rogers, and Susan Anderson and Bob Arthur of Magellan Corporation announced on August 12 that they will be matching all player donations for #SkyTakesAction.

"As owners of the Sky, John [Rogers] and I are honored to join our players and support their unprecedented commitment to social justice," said Sky owner Michael Alter. "We could not be more proud of their efforts. We will personally match their contributions to the organizations they have identified to carry out the important work in our communities. We are also thrilled that Bob Arthur and Susan Anderson, long time champions of the Sky, will also be matching the players donations."

Lastly, **Courtney Vandersloot will be donating \$10** for each assist she records to DonorsChoose (an organization that helps cover the cost of classroom supplies for teachers) while **Allie Quigley will contribute \$20 for every 3-point field goal she makes** to the Joliet, Illinois area Salvation Army. Vandersloot has raised **\$2,447** through fan support while donating an additional **\$1,400** through her total assists. Quigley's 3-point total through 16 games is **\$640**, and through fan support has raised **\$1,607**. Both players have already raised more than 40% of their **\$5000 goal**.

"It's not a secret that public school funding is an ongoing problem," Vandersloot said. "We have teachers all over the country paying millions of dollars out of pocket for supplies in order to provide the proper education to their students. The Chicago Public Schools are no stranger to that. Despite being the 3rd largest district in the nation, the CPS only receives 15% of the state funding. It's not a coincidence that 90% of the CPS students are children of color. I realize the problem will not be solved tomorrow, but I want to be a part of the change TODAY."

"After talking with family and doing a lot of research, I decided to choose the Salvation Army based out of the Chicagoland area," Quigley said. "I was specifically drawn to the great work they are doing in the areas of fighting for justice and empowering the youth. I grew up in Joliet, Illinois and after reflecting the last few months, it's not fair that kids growing up 40 miles north on the south side of Chicago didn't have that same opportunity. I think all children and people deserve an equal chance in this life regardless of race or where they grew up. I want to be a part of this change and I think the Salvation Army is a great partner to help me do that."

- Over the course of the last three seasons (including 2020), Sky has won five of the seven meetings between the two franchises, over a fourth of its win total against the Fever.
- Sky last swept season series with Indiana in 2015 (four wins).

- This is the second of two games this season between the Fever and Sky.

LAST GAME VS. INDIANA

- The Sky was led by **Kahleah Copper and Courtney Vandersloot**, who scored 26 (a career-high for Copper) and 23 points respectively (a season-high for Vandersloot).
- **Courtney Vandersloot** reached 1,800 career assists after getting her second helper of the game. She is now one of five players to hit that milestone.
- Indiana scored just 12 points (tied for its season low) in the first quarter for the second time in its last three games at the time. (Connecticut 8/18).

INDIANA INSIGHTS

- Indiana has lost five of its last six games, with its one win coming against the league-leading Seattle Storm (12-3).
- The Fever is averaging 85 points against in that six-game stretch.
- Indiana has scored over 80 points just once in that stretch (84 vs. Seattle).

NEWS, NOTES, TALKING POINTS

LAST GAME:The Sky's loss to the Seattle Storm marked the first time this season that it lost back-to-back games. It was led by **Kahleah Copper**, who scored a team-high 19 points on 8-15 (53.3%) shooting from the floor. Chicago failed to score at least 80 points for just the third time this season, two of which have come against Seattle. The Sky has averaged 72.5 PPG against the Storm this season. By contrast, its seasonal figure is 87.0 PPG.

PLAYOFFS IN THE WUBBLE: Despite the loss, Chicago remains in a prime position to reach the postseason for the second straight year. It needs just two more victories in its next six games to reach a winning season, which would be the fifth in franchise history. The Sky has not had back-to-back winning seasons since 2015 and 2016, going 21-13 and 18-16 respectively.

OK CLASS, WHAT'S THREE SQUARED? **Courtney Vandersloot** announced on August 12 that she will be donating \$10 for each assist she records this season to DonorsChoose, an organization that helps cover the cost of classroom supplies for teachers across the country. She has contributed \$1,400 through 16 games this season, over a fifth of her \$5,000 goal. Her combined total with fan donations is \$3,847. Saturday's game marked the third straight outing where she recorded nine assists. In addition, the 10-year veteran has posted at least nine helpers in five straight games. Vandersloot leads the WNBA with 8.8 APG, three more than Jordin Canada of the Seattle Storm who ranks second (5.6).

OFFENSIVE PRODUCTION: Chicago ranks first in field goal percentage (49.1%) and assists per game (21.3, tied with Seattle). It ranks second in points per game (87.0), trailing only the Las Vegas Aces (87.9). The Sky also ranks fourth in the league in 3-point percentage (36.0%) and blocks per game (3.9). No other team in the WNBA ranks among the top three in points per game, field goal percentage and assists.

TAKING BETTER CARE OF THE BALL:Over the course of its last four games, Chicago is averaging just under 12 turnovers per game, well below its season average of 16.1. Chicago is still among the bottom half of teams in the league in TPG (16.1, 8th) and is ninth in opponent points off turnovers (18.8). It gave up 17 points off turnovers during Saturday's game against Seattle.

A NEW KFC: **Kahleah Copper** has gone 13 straight games with a double-digit scoring total. She's averaging 15.4 PPG, more than double her career average of 7.2 PPG and is shooting 50.8% from the floor. Copper has shot at least 50% in six of her last eight games, and played over 30 minutes for the third straight occasion on Saturday (33).

THE QUIGLEY ENGINE KEEPS RUNNING: **Allie Quigley's** 11-point performance during Saturday's game against Seattle marked the 15th time this season she scored 10 points or more. She's scored at least 14 points in six of her last eight games. Quigley is shooting a career-high from the free throw line (25-27, 92.6%, minimum 10 attempts), having not missed from there since August 8 against Connecticut.

HEBARD'S ELITE SHOOTING: **Ruthy Hebard** currently ranks second in the WNBA in field goal percentage (minimum 10 attempts), with a 62.5% clip from the floor during her first 15 career games. She has shot better than 50% in nine consecutive games.

TWO ADDITIONS:The Sky acquired forward **Stephanie Mavunga** on August 28 as part of a trade that sent Jantel Lavender as well as a 2021 second and third round pick to the Indiana Fever. The third-year player has been out since August 7, but was having her best statistical season up to that point. Mavunga is averaging 5.0 PPG, 4.0 RPG and playing just under 12 minutes per game, all career-highs. In addition, Chicago signed forward **Alisia Jenkins** to a 7-day contract on August 31. Jenkins has appeared in one game this season, playing two minutes with the Indiana Fever on August 25 against the Seattle Storm.

- Tied Sky franchise record for most assists in a half (10). Contributed to 11 of the Sky's 18 field goals in the first half
- Reached a double-digit assist total for 50th time in her career
- 15 assists was her season-high and tied for her career-high (she's done it 3 times)
- Recorded her 32nd career double-double (15 points, 15 assists), third this season
- Became first player in WNBA history to have a 15+ point, 15+ assist, 5 rebound game

August 20, New York Liberty

- 10 assists gave her 25 over the last two games, the 5th time in her career she posted at least 25 assists in back-to-back games (Sky record)
- Posted a season-high four steals
- 19 points, 10 assists led to her 33rd career double-double, fourth this season

August 22, Indiana Fever

- Reached 1,800 assists with her second of the game
- One of five players in WNBA history to reach that feat (Sue Bird, Ticha Penicheiro, Diana Taurasi and Lindsay Whalen)
- Season-high 23 points

And so, I mean it motivates me definitely a little bit extra because like that could have been my dad. George Floyd could've been my dad. Breonna Taylor could have been my sister. It could have been me. It could have been some of my teammates, like it's just this is real life right now, and it's a lot to take in but I mean I'm proud of our team for the awareness that we're raising and the stuff that we're doing."

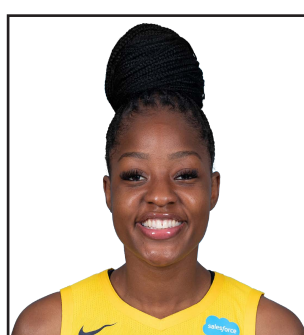
