#SKYTAKESACTION

Chicago Sky players will donate \$10 for every point scored, \$100 for every win, and \$50 for any loss throughout the 2020 WNBA season under a social justice initiative called #SkyTakesAction.

"#SkyTakesAction is about longevity and community," Gabby Williams said. "It's about inspiring others and teaching everyone that it doesn't take much to change someone's life, or improve somebody's situation as long as we work together. Of course, our goal is to raise absolutely as much money as possible for the organizations we've chosen. But it's also about education and changing the norm. Hopefully this will inspire and teach our fans and those who hear us to increase their level of involvement in the community."

Fans have answered Williams' call to show support by raising **\$11,285** in five weeks of fundraising through Athletes For Justice. The Sky as a team has donated **\$16,320** through its total points, 11 wins and six losses this season. In addition, Sky owner Michael Alter, minority owner John Rogers, and Susan Anderson and Bob Arthur of Magellan Corporation announced on August 12 that they will be matching all player donations for #SkyTakesAction. With their matches, the combined total is now **\$43,925**.

"As owners of the Sky, John [Rogers] and I are honored to join our players and support their unprecedented commitment to social justice," said Sky owner Michael Alter. "We could not be more proud of their efforts. We will personally match their contributions to the organizations they have identified to carry out the important work in our communities. We are also thrilled that Bob Arthur and Susan Anderson, long time champions of the Sky, will also be matching the players donations."

Lastly, **Courtney Vandersloot will be donating \$10** for each assist she records to DonorsChoose (an organization that helps cover the cost of classroom supplies for teachers) while **Allie Quigley will contribute \$20 for every 3-point field goal she makes** to the Joilet, Illinois area Salvation Army. Vandersloot has raised **\$3,107** through fan support while donating an additional **\$1,580** through her total assists. Quigley's 3-point total through 17 games is **\$720**, and through fan support has raised **\$1,700**. Both players have already raised more than 40% of their **\$5,000 goal**. In addition, **Stefanie Dolson, Kahleah Copper** and **Gabby Williams** all are auctioning off customized apparel to support social justice initiatives.

"It's not a secret that public school funding is an ongoing problem," Vandersloot said. "We have teachers all over the country paying millions of dollars out of pocket for supplies in order to provide the proper education to their students. The Chicago Public Schools are no stranger to that. Despite being the 3rd largest district in the nation, the CPS only receives 15% of the state funding. It's not a coincidence that 90% of the CPS students are children of color. I realize the problem will not be solved tomorrow, but I want to be a part of the change TODAY."

"After talking with family and doing a lot of research, I decided to choose the Salvation Army based out of the Chicagoland area," Quigley said. "I was specifically drawn to the great work they are doing in the areas of fighting for justice and empowering the youth. I grew up in Joliet, Illinois and after reflecting the last few months, it's not fair that kids growing up 40 miles north on the south side of Chicago didn't have that same opportunity. I think all children and people deserve an equal chance in this life regardless of race or where they grew up. I want to be a part of this change and I think the Salvation Army is a great partner to help me do that."

LAST GAME VS. MINNESOTA

- The Sky was led by **Courtney Vandersloot**, **Azurá Stevens** and **Cheyenne Parker**, who all scored 16 points on a combined 54.8% (17-31) shooting. Parker recorded her seventh career double-double (16 points, 10 rebounds).
- **Courtney Vandersloot** passed Becky Hammon for 5th on the WNBA's all-time assists list (1,705). She now currently has 1,843.
- **Crystal Dangerfield** became the first Lynx rookie to start at point guard since Renee Montgomery did so in 2009.

MINNESOTA MEMENTOS

- Minnesota has won three of its last five games, including most recently defeating the Los Angeles Sparks 96-78.
- The Lynx are averaging just 79.6 points against in that five-game stretch.
- Minnesota has scored at least 88 (including two with at least 90) points in three of those five games.

NEWS, NOTES, TALKING POINTS

LAST GAME The Sky reached the century mark for the third time this season, defeating the Indiana Fever 100-77. The 23-point margin was Chicago's second-highest this season (25 vs. Atlanta on 8/16). **Courtney Vandersloot** broke the WNBA record for most assists in a single game (18), a feat that had not been broken in 18 years (16 set twice by Ticha Penicheiro, most recently August 3, 2002). Chicago shot 54.3% from the floor, with 29 of its 38 made field goals coming off an assist. In addition, Sky limited Indiana's leading scorer in Kelsey Mitchell (17.5 PPG) to just two points on 0-7 shooting from the floor.

PLAYOFFS IN THE WUBBLE: Chicago clinched the postseason for the second straight year Tuesday after the Indiana Fever lost to the Atlanta Dream. It needs just one more victory in its next five games to reach a winning season, which would be the fifth in franchise history. The Sky has not had back-to-back winning seasons since 2015 and 2016, going 21-13 and 18-16 respectively.

ALONG TIME COMING: Courtney Vandersloot was named the WNBA's Eastern Conference Player of the Month for August, the first time she has earned the honor. She averaged 13.6 PPG and 9.5 APG in the Sky's 14 games. During Monday's game against Indiana, she broke Ticha Penicheiro's record for most assists in a game (18, previously set at 16). In addition, the 18-assist, 13-point performance marked the 52nd time in her career she reached a double-digit assist total and the 34th double-double of her career. Vandersloot announced on August 12 that she will be donating \$10 for each assist she records this season to DonorsChoose, an organization that helps cover the cost of classroom supplies for teachers across the country. She has contributed \$1,580 through 17 games this season, over 30% of her \$5,000 goal. Her combined total with fan donations is \$4,687. Monday's game marked the sixth straight outing where she recorded at least nine assists. Vandersloot leads the WNBA with 9.3 APG, nearly four more than Jordin Canada and Jullie Allemand who are tied for second (5.6).

RECORD-BREAKING OFFENSE: Chicago ranks first in field goal percentage (49.4%) and assists per game (21.7). If the Sky's field goal percentage keeps its pace, it will break the all-time record for highest ever in a season (Los Angeles Sparks 2016, 48.7%). It also is tied for first in points per game (87.8) with the Las Vegas Aces. The Sky ranks fourth in the league in 3-pointers made (129) and blocks per game (4.0). In addition, its recent stretch of strong play from the free throw line shooting 83% over its last five games) has pushed the Sky into fifth in the league in FT% (81.1%). No other team in the WNBA ranks among the top three in points per game, field goal percentage and assists.

TAKING BETTER CARE OF THE BALL: Over the course of its last five games, Chicago is averaging just under 12 turnovers per game, well below its season average of 15.8. Chicago is still among the bottom half of teams in the league in TPG (15.8, 8th) and is ninth in opponent points off turnovers (18.3). It gave up 17 points off turnovers for the second straight game on Monday against Indiana.

THAT PHILLY MENTALITY: **Kahleah Copper** has gone 14 straight games with a double-digit scoring total. She's averaging 15.7 PPG, more than double her career average of 7.2 PPG and is shooting 51.4% from the floor. Copper has shot at least 50% in seven of her last nine games, and played over 30 minutes for the fourth straight occasion on Monday (34). Her 21 points against the Fever marked the third time this season she scored over 20, two of which came against Indiana.

IS THERE A BETTER FEELING? **Allie Quigley** hit the 3-point shot that sent her wife **Courtney Vandersloot** into the WNBA record books with the most assists in a single game in WNBA history (18). Her 19-point performance during Monday's game against Indiana marked the 16th time this season she scored 10 points or more. She's scored at least 14 points in seven of her last nine games. Quigley is shooting a career-high from the free throw line (26-28, 92.9%, minimum 10 attempts), having not missed from there since August 8 against Connecticut.

HEBARD AMONG SHOOTING LEADERS: **Ruthy Hebard** currently ranks third in the WNBA in field goal percentage (minimum 10 attempts), with a 66.1% clip from the floor during her first 17 career games. She has shot better than 50% in 10 consecutive outings. Her double-double on Monday was the first to be done by a Sky rookie since Diamond DeShields scored 23 points and brought in 11 rebounds against the Atlanta Dream on June 27, 2018. Hebard is the ninth rookie in Sky franchise history to record a double-double.

Vandersloot was also named the Eastern Conference Player of the Month for the first time in her career for the month of August.
