SERIES NOTES

- Over the course of the last three seasons (including 2020), the Mystics have won six of the last eight meetings between the two franchises.
- Washington's average margin of victory in those six wins is just under 17 points.
- Sky is 29-25 all-time vs. the Mystics. Its 29 victories in the series is its second-most against any team (30 against Atlanta Dream).
- This is the second of two games this season between the Mystics and Sky.

LAST GAME VS. WASHINGTON

- The Sky was led by **Cheyenne Parker and Gabby Williams**. They both scored 16 points on a combined 13-23 shooting, including a 4-5 clip from beyond the 3-point line for Williams, which was a career high in made shots from three for her.
- This was the third of four games to start the season where the Sky's margin of victory or defeat came by two points.
- Sky handed Mystics their first loss of the 2020 season. Washington has won one game since the two teams met on August 1.

WASHINGTON SYNOPSIS

- Mystics have lost five straight games and 12 of their last 13 after starting the season 3-0.
- Five of the team's 12 losses in that stretch have come by at least 13 points.
- Washington has failed to score at least 75 points in seven of those 12 defeats.

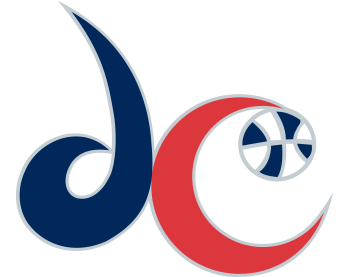

- Became the Sky's all-time leader in seasons played with the team, her 10th season with the franchise
- She surpassed Tamera Young (nine seasons)
- Reached a double-digit assist total for the 46th time in her career

August 18, Las Vegas Aces

- Tied Sky franchise record for most assists in a half (10). Contributed to 11 of the Sky's 18 field goals in the first half
- Reached a double-digit assist total for 50th time in her career
- 15 assists was her season-high and tied for her career-high (she's done it 3 times)
- Recorded her 32nd career double-double (15 points, 15 assists), third this season
- Became first player in WNBA history to have a 15+ point, 15+ assist, 5 rebound game

August 20, New York Liberty

- 10 assists gave her 25 over the last two games, the 5th time in her career she posted at least 25 assists in back-to-back games (Sky record)
- Posted a season-high four steals
- 19 points, 10 assists led to her 33rd career double-double, fourth this season

August 22, Indiana Fever

- Reached 1,800 assists with her second of the game
- One of five players in WNBA history to reach that feat (Sue Bird, Ticha Penicheiro, Diana Taurasi and Lindsay Whalen)
- Season-high 23 points

August 25, New York Liberty

- Scored a double-digit total for the seventh consecutive game
- Recorded at least nine assists for the fourth straight outing

August 29, Seattle Storm

- Recorded at least nine assists for the fifth straight outing

- **Set the WNBA record for most assists in a single game (18)**

NEWS, NOTES, TALKING POINTS

LASTGAME: The Sky lost its third of its last four games on Wednesday to the Minnesota Lynx. It is the second straight year that Minnesota has swept the season series against Chicago. Sky was led by **Allie Quigley**, who surpassed current Lynx center Sylvia Fowles as the franchise's No. 1 scorer all-time. Her 23 points pushed her career total to just over 3,000 (3,002). In addition, **Cheyenne Parker** recorded her second double-double of the season (her first also coming against Minnesota on July 30), scoring 20 points and bringing in a career-high 15 rebounds. Despite losing both games to the Lynx this season, the margin of defeat for the Sky in those match-ups was just five points combined.

POSTSEASON BUBBLE BASKETBALL: Chicago clinched the postseason for the second straight year Tuesday after the Indiana Fever lost to the Atlanta Dream. It needs just one more victory in its next four games to reach a winning season, which would be the fifth in franchise history. The Sky has not had back-to-back winning seasons since 2015 and 2016, going 21-13 and 18-16 respectively.

IT'S TO BE EXPECTED AT THIS POINT (GAWD):

Courtney Vandersloot was named the WNBA's Eastern Conference Player of the Month for August, the first time she has earned the honor. She averaged 13.6 PPG and 9.5 APG in the Sky's 14 games. During Monday's game against Indiana, she broke Ticha Penicheiro's record for most assists in a game (18, previously set at 16). She followed that record-breaking performance with a 13-point, 12-assist double-double on Wednesday, the 35th of her career (sixth this season). In addition, it was her 53rd career game with a double-figure assist total. Vandersloot has gone seven straight games with at least nine assists. She announced on August 12 that she will be donating \$10 for each assist she records this season to DonorsChoose, an organization that helps cover the cost of classroom supplies for teachers across the country. She has contributed \$1,700 through 18 games this season, and with the overwhelming support from her fans she has surpassed her \$5,000 goal with still four games to play. Vandersloot leads the WNBA with 9.4 APG, nearly four more than Jordin Canada and Jullie Allemand who are tied for second (5.6).

MORE RECORDS: Chicago ranks first in field goal percentage (49.4%) and assists per game (21.8). If the Sky's field goal percentage keeps its pace, it will break the all-time record for highest ever in a season (Los Angeles Sparks 2016, 48.7%). It is just behind the Las Vegas Aces for first in points per game (87.5, Vegas-87.8). The Sky ranks fourth in the league in 3-pointers made (138) and blocks per game (4.1). In addition, its recent stretch of strong play from the free throw line (shooting 84% over its last five games) has pushed the Sky into fourth in the league in FT% (81.4%). No other team in the WNBA ranks among the top three in points per game, field goal percentage and assists.

TURNOVER ISSUES RETURN: The Sky committed a season-high 23 turnovers during Wednesday's game against Minnesota, where the Lynx were able to convert those mistakes into 22 points. Chicago ranks 10th in both TPG (16.2) and opponent points of turnovers (18.5).

NOTHING BUNDT POINTS: **Kahleah Copper** has gone 15 straight games with a double-digit scoring total. She's averaging 15.4 PPG, and is shooting 50.9% from the floor. Copper has shot at least 50% in seven of her last 10 games, and played over 30 minutes for the fifth straight occasion on Wednesday (35).

No. 14 BECOMES No. 1: Allie Quigley became the Sky's all-time leading scorer during Wednesday's game against Minnesota, surpassing Sylvia Fowles (2,927 points). In addition, the 12-year veteran reached 3,000 career points during the fourth quarter, part of her team-high 23-point game. She has reached a double-digit scoring total in 17 of 18 games this season, including six straight. She is shooting a career-best 93.5% from the free throw line (minimum 10 attempts), having not missed from the charity stripe since August 8, which was the only game this season where she missed free throws.

HEBARD EXCELLENT AT THE RIM: Ruthy Hebard currently ranks first in the WNBA in field goal percentage (minimum 10 attempts), with a 66.7% clip from the floor during her first 18 career games. She has shot better than 50% in 11 consecutive outings. Her double-double on Monday was the first to be done by a Sky rookie since Diamond DeShields scored 23 points and brought in 11 rebounds against the Atlanta Dream on June 27, 2018. Hebard is the ninth rookie in Sky franchise history to record a double-double.

#SKYTAKESACTION

Chicago Sky players will donate \$10 for every point scored, \$100 for every win, and \$50 for any loss throughout the 2020 WNBA season under a social justice initiative called #SkyTakesAction.

"#SkyTakesAction is about longevity and community," Gabby Williams said. "It's about inspiring others and teaching everyone that it doesn't take much to change someone's life, or improve somebody's situation as long as we work together. Of course, our goal is to raise absolutely as much money as possible for the organizations we've chosen. But it's also about education and changing the norm. Hopefully this will inspire and teach our fans and those who hear us to increase their level of involvement in the community."

Fans have answered Williams' call to show support by raising **\$11,360** in five weeks of fundraising through Athletes For Justice. The Sky as a team has donated **\$17,150** through its total points, 11 wins and seven losses this season. In addition, Sky owner Michael Alter, minority owner John Rogers, and Susan Anderson and Bob Arthur of Magellan Corporation announced on August 12 that they will be matching all player donations for #SkyTakesAction.

"As owners of the Sky, John [Rogers] and I are honored to join our players and support their unprecedented commitment to social justice," said Sky owner Michael Alter. "We could not be more proud of their efforts. We will personally match their contributions to the organizations they have identified to carry out the important work in our communities. We are also thrilled that Bob Arthur and Susan Anderson, long time champions of the Sky, will also be matching the players donations."

Lastly, **Courtney Vandersloot will be donating \$10** for each assist she records to DonorsChoose (an organization that helps cover the cost of classroom supplies for teachers) while **Allie Quigley will contribute \$20 for every 3-point field goal she makes** to the Joliet, Illinois area Salvation Army. Vandersloot has raised **\$3,526** through fan support while donating an additional **\$1,700** through her total assists. Vandersloot has surpassed her \$5,000 goal with four games to play. Quigley's 3-point total through 18 games is **\$760**, and through fan support has raised **\$1,700**. In addition, **Stefanie Dolson, Kahleah Copper** and **Gabby Williams** all are auctioning off customized apparel to support social justice initiatives.

With ownership matches, additional player contributions, fan donations and more the combined total is now **\$56,631**.

"It's not a secret that public school funding is an ongoing problem," Vandersloot said. "We have teachers all over the country paying millions of dollars out of pocket for supplies in order to provide the proper education to their students. The Chicago Public Schools are no stranger to that. Despite being the 3rd largest district in the nation, the CPS only receives 15% of the state funding. It's not a coincidence that 90% of the CPS students are children of color. I realize the problem will not be solved tomorrow, but I want to be a part of the change TODAY."

"After talking with family and doing a lot of research, I decided to choose the Salvation Army based out of the Chicagoland area," Quigley said. "I was specifically drawn to the great work they are doing in the areas of fighting for justice and empowering the youth. I grew up in Joliet, Illinois and after reflecting the last few months, it's not fair that kids growing up 40 miles north on the south side of Chicgo didn't have that same opportunity. I think all children and people deserve an equal chance in this life regardless of race or where they grew up. I want to be a part of this change and I think the Salvation Army is a great partner to help me do that."

MORE TO COME: Colson has donated \$280 (28 points) to #SkyTakesAction this season. She tied for her season-high in minutes (16) during Saturday's loss to Seattle, also posting a season-high in points (6). Colson played just six minutes for the second straight game on Wednesday, scoring two points with two assists.

BASKETBALL COMES SECOND: Colson is a member of the WNBA Social Justice Council, where she and other players will help serve as representatives for helping create meaningful conversations about race, LGBTQ support, gun control, voting rights and other relevant social issues in the United States.

COLSON ON THE SOCIAL JUSTICE COUNCIL: "I think that people will enjoy and learn from a lot of the things that we'll present to everyone. It's an awesome opportunity and I hope that people will help us amplify our message and people feel like they are gaining something from it and then that they take action and change things in their lives and in the lives of their family and friends."

AIN'T THIS WHAT THEY'VE BEEN WAITING FOR?: Copper has donated \$2,770 to the #SkyTakesAction initiative this season. Her 10-point performance against the Lynx marked the 15th straight game where she had a double-figure scoring total. Copper has scored at least 15 points in five of her last seven games, including two 20+ point outings.

She is 13th in the WNBA in PPG (15.4), sitting right behind teammate Allie Quigley (15.7, 12th) and ahead of names such as Angel McCoughtry (14.3) and Candace Parker (13.7).
