NEWS, NOTES, TALKING POINTS

LAST GAME: The Sky lost its fifth of its last sixth games on Sunday to the Los Angeles Sparks, including its third straight. It is the longest losing streak of the season for Chicago. It had a four-game losing streak once in 2019, which was its longest. Cheyenne Parker led the Sky in scoring on Sunday, dropping a career-high 24 points while pulling in 10 rebounds. It was her second double-double in her last three games. She is averaging just over 22 points, 10 rebounds and shooting 70.3% over the course of her last three outings. Chicago had just three players reach a double-digit scoring total (Parker (24), Quigley (22), Copper (14)), with Gabby Williams being the only player off the bench to score (nine points).

POSTSEASON BUBBLE BASKETBALL: Chicago clinched the postseason for the second straight year on September 1 after the Indiana Fever lost to the Atlanta Dream. It needs just one more victory in its next two games to reach a winning season, which would be the fifth in franchise history. The Sky has not had back-to-back winning seasons since 2015 and 2016, going 21-13 and 18-16 respectively.

APPRECIATE IT WHILE IT LASTS: Courtney Vandersloot was named the WNBA's Eastern Conference Player of the Month for August, the first time she has earned the honor. She averaged 13.6 PPG and 9.5 APG in the Sky's 14 games. During the game against Indiana on August 31, she broke Ticha Penicheiro's record for most assists in a game (18, previously set at 16). She continued her strong stretch of play on Sunday by posting her 55th career game with a double-figure assist total, which marked the third time this season she posted at least 15 assists. Vandersloot has gone nine straight games with at least nine assists. She announced on August 12 that she will be donating \$10 for each assist she records this season to DonorsChoose, an organization that helps cover the cost of classroom supplies for teachers across the country. She has contributed \$1,960 through 20 games this season, and with the overwhelming support from her fans she has surpassed her \$5,000 goal with still two games to play. Vandersloot leads the WNBA with 9.8 APG, nearly four more than Jordin Canada and Jullie Allemand who are tied for second (5.6).

OFFENSE CLOSE TO MAKING HISTORY: Chicago ranks first in field goal percentage (48.9%) and assists per game (21.7). If the Sky's field goal percentage keeps its pace, it will break the all-time record for highest ever in a season (Los Angeles Sparks 2016, 48.7%). It is fourth in blocks per game (4.0) and points (86.2). Chicago is also fifth in both major metrics from beyond the 3-point line (153 made and 34.7%).

TURNOVERS DICTACTING GAMES: The Sky only committed five turnovers in the first half on Sunday against the Sparks, giving itself a one-point lead through the first two frames. However, Chicago gave the ball away 10 times in the second half, causing LA to score 12 points off those takeaways and win the game by six. Chicago ranks 10th in both TPG (16.0) and opponent points of turnovers (18.1).

MOST IMPROVED CANDIDATE: Kahleah Copper is averaging 14.9 PPG, and is shooting a career-best 49.8% from the floor. She played over 30 minutes for the seventh straight occasion on Sunday (37), a career-high. Her 14-point performance against the Sparks marked the 18th time this season where she reached a double-digit scoring total.

NO. 14 BECOMES NO. 1: Allie Quigley became the Sky's all-time leading scorer during the game against Minnesota on September 2, surpassing Sylvia Fowles (2,927 points). In addition, the 12-year veteran reached 3,000 career points during the fourth quarter, part of her team-high 23-point game. She has reached a double-digit scoring total in 19 of 20 games this season, including eight straight. In addition, Quigley has scored 20+ points in two of her last three games and five times this season. She is shooting a career-best 91.4% from the free throw line (minimum 10 attempts). Quigley made 26 consecutive free throws before missing one against Los Angeles on Sunday.

HEBARD'S ELITE SHOOTING PERCENTAGE: Ruthy Hebard currently ranks first in the WNBA in field goal percentage (minimum 10 attempts), with a 67.2% clip from the floor during her first 20 career games. She has shot better than 50% in 13 consecutive outings. Her double-double on August 31 was the first to be done by a Sky rookie since Diamond DeShields scored 23 points and brought in 11 rebounds against the Atlanta Dream on June 27, 2018. Hebard is the ninth rookie in Sky franchise history to record a double-double.

RUTHY'S GETTING HER CHANCE

Hebard shot at least 50% for the 13th straight time on Sunday. During the game against Indiana on August 31, she recorded her first career double-double (12 points, 11 rebounds). She was the ninth rookie in Sky franchise history to record a double-double, and the first since Diamond DeShields did so on June 27, 2018 (23 points, 11 rebounds). During this stretch of 13 games, she is shooting 71.1% (37-52) from the floor, averaging just under seven points per game.

In addition, the rookie has contributed \$950 (95 points) to #SkyTakesAction this season. She also ranks first in the WNBA in FG% (67.2%, minimum 10 attempts).

QUIGL8Y: Quigley cemented herself once again in the Sky record books as she surpassed Sylvia Fowles for No.1 all-time on the franchise scoring list on September 2 against the Minnesota Lynx. In addition, she reached 3,000 career points in the fourth quarter. Her 22 points against the Sparks on Sunday gave her 19 games this season with a double-digit scoring total, including eight straight. She is also shooting 91.4% (32-35) from the free throw line this season, a career-best (minimum 10 attempts). Quigley made 26 free throws in a row before missing in the first quarter against LA on Sunday. It was her first miss from the charity stripe since August 8 against Connecticut, the only other game this season where she missed a free throw.

The 12-year veteran has donated \$3,170 (317 points) to the #SkyTakesAction initiative. In addition, Quigley announced on August 12 that she will be donating \$20 for every 3-point field goal she makes this season to the Joilet, Illinois Salvation Army. She has contributed \$900 through 20 games this season, which has helped raise funding for a food pantry, Christmas/holiday presents, interview clothing for clients seeking new employment, one month of transportation for a client, a month of intensive casework for two clients and setting up utilities, purchasing food and furniture for clients as they begin a new life.
