LAST GAME: Chicago's 82-79 victory over Dallas marks 1st time since 2014 Sky has started season winning 4 out of first 5 games.

- Chicago remains atop of the WNBA standings with a record of 4-1.
- ❖ Three of the four Sky victories this season have been by three or fewer points.
- WNBA veteran Sydney Colson made her Sky and 2020 season debut.
- ♣ Azurá Stevens posted her 2nd career double-double off a 15-point, 10-rebound outing.
 ▶ It was her 2nd double-double in the last 3 games.
- Cheyenne Parker, Azurá Stevens and Kahleah Copper accounted for 28 of the Sky's 43 first half points.
 The aforementioned three players shot a combined 68.8% from the floor (11-16) in the first half.
- ❖ The Sky's starting five had a collective plus-minus of 56 and shot just under 53% (27-51) from the floor.
- ❖ **Allie Quigley**, **Stevens** and **Parker** each recorded 15 points, tying for the team-high tonight. It was the third consecutive game where Parker led or tied for the lead in scoring for the Sky.



EXCELLING IN HER ROLE: Copper has had the best start to a season of her career, posting a double-digit scoring total in four of her first five games. In addition, she has shot north of 50% from the floor in every game this season. Her 14.0 PPG is over seven points higher than her career average throughout her first four seasons in the WNBA (6.7).

Head Coach and GM James Wade on Copper:

"I'm trying to diversify her game and making her a more complete player, but where we're satisfied with her progress. So we're just going to keep going."

LEADING AT ALL COSTS: Despite the COVID-19 Pandemic, Copper is still looking to use her organization 2K Skills and Drills to help provide opportunities for young girls to play basketball in Philadelphia. She has donated \$700 (70 points) to #SkyTakes Action this season through five games.

GAINING MOMENTUM: DeShields played her best game of the season against the defending WNBA Champions Washington Mystics, scoring 10 points off the bench while shooting four of six from the floor.

TAKING ACTION: DeShields joins teammate Gabby Williams as serving as the face and leader of the Sky's #SkyTakesAction campaign for this season. She and Williams worked alongside former Chicago Bears linebacker Sam Acho to develop the campaign in partnership with Athletes for Justice. Through her scoring so far, DeShields has contributed \$340 (34 points).

DeShields on how #SkyTakesAction has motivated her: "It's everything. It's literally the reason why I put my jersey, it's the reason why I came out here. There was no way I was going to come out here and just dismiss myself from what's going on in the world right now. So, to have partnered up with Athletes For Justice and my teammates and everybody else, our sponsors to be on board with this, it's all the motivation that any of us needs on game days."

A RETURN TO NORMALCY: After failing to play in at least 33 games for the first time in her career in 2018, Dolson responded in 2019 by starting and appearing in all 34 games. She continued to be one of the most efficient options on the floor for the Sky, as she finished fourth in the league in field goal percentage (51.9%). Dolson also made at least 30 three-point field goals for the second time in three years, shooting 36.1% from distance.

AN ACTIVE LEADER: Dolson will be working with the Brave Space Alliance, which is a black and trans-led organization that supports and educates the LGBTQ community, as part of her work toward social justice this season. She has contributed \$80 (8 points) toward the #SkyTakesAction campaign thus far.

She has recorded at least 10 points in all five games this season, where her totals have produced \$620 (62 points) to the #SkyTakesAction campaign.

Quigley has had her best stretch of the season thus far in the last two games. Against Washington, she scored 15 points and shot just under 50% from the floor while going three for six from distance. She followed up that strong performance by again scoring 15 points while shooting 54.5% (6-11) from the floor against Dallas.
