SERIES NOTES

- > Tonight's game is the first time that the Sun and Sky will square off against each other in the postseason.
- > The Sun is one of six teams in the WNBA that the Sky has never played in the playoffs.
- In the regular season, Chicago has won three of its last five against Connecticut.

LAST GAME VS. CONNECTICUT

- > Sky scored below 80 points for the second of its last three games at the time.
- > Chicago was led by **Cheyenne Parker and Allie Quigley,** who scored 33 points total (17 & 16 respectfully) on a combined 12-21 (57%) shooting.
- > Sun pulled in 12 offensive rebounds, scoring 13 second chance points.
- > Chicago committed 15 turnovers, but Connecticut only scored eight points off of those takeaways.

CONNECTICUT SEASON RECAP

- Lost first five games of season, went on to win 10 of next 17.
- > Three of its wins came against teams that reached the 2020 WNBA Playoffs.
- One of two teams to clinch a postseason berth despite having a record below .500.



NEWS, NOTES, TALKING POINTS

LAST GAME: The Sky ended the regular season by breaking its four-game losing streak with a win over the Dallas Wings. It was the fifth time Chicago scored at least 90 points this season. **CHEYENNE PARKER** led the Sky in scoring, dropping 23 points while pulling in seven rebounds. **RUTHY HEBARD** scored a career-high 22 points with seven rebounds, shooting a highly efficient 9-12 from the floor.

POSTSEASON BUBBLE BASKETBALL: Chicago picked up its first stretch of back-to-back winning seasons since 2015 and 2016 (20-14 & 12-10), which was also the last time it went two consecutive years with a winning record. This year marks the fifth time in Sky franchise history that the team will play in the postseason.

SHE STANDS ALONE: COURTNEY VANDERSLOOT became the first player in WNBA history to average 10 APG in a season. She won her fourth consecutive WNBA Peak Performer Award on September 14. Vandersloot is now tied with DIANA TAURASI for most consecutive seaons with earning the honor (Taurasi did so in scoring from 2008-11). She averaged a career-high 13.6 PPG and 10.0 APG. Vandersloot enters the postseason playing her best basketball of the season, as she has gone 11 straight games with at least nine assists and has posted a double-double in five of her last six games. She announced on August 12 that she will be donating \$10 for each assist she records this season to DonorsChoose, an organization that helps cover the cost of classroom supplies for teachers across the country. Her donations will carry over to the postseason. She contributed \$2,190 in the regular season and with the overwhelming support from her fans she easily surpassed her \$5,000 goal. Vandersloot led the WNBA in APG.

OFFENSE MAKES HISTORY: Chicago broke the all-time record for highest FG% in a season (49.1%), previously set by the Los Angeles Sparks in 2016 (48.7%). It finished second in the league in APG (21.8), just behind the Seattle Storm (21.9). Sky finished third in PPG (86.7), blocks per game (4.0) and fifth in 3-point percentage (35.1%).

TURNOVERS TELL THE STORY?: The Sky ranked 10th in both TPG (15.6) and opponent points of turnovers (18.1). In its two games against Connecticut this season, Chicago averaged 18 turnovers. Interesting enough, Sky won the game where it committed 21 turnovers, whereas it lost the tilt against the Sun when it gave the ball away 15 times.

MOST IMPROVED CANDIDATE: KAHLEAH COPPER averaged 14.8 PPG this season, and shot a career-best 49.6% from the floor. Her PPG in 2020 was more than double the average she had within the first four years of her career (6.7). She was one of two Sky players to post a double-digit scoring total in 20 of 22 games this season, the other being Allie Quigley. Copper also had three 20+ point outings this season, more than the total from her previous four years combined (2).

CHICAGO'S ALL-TIME HOUSEHOLD: ALLIE QUIGLEY became the Sky's all-time leading scorer during the game against Minnesota on September 2, surpassing Sylvia Fowles (2,927 points). Her wife **COURTNEY VANDERSLOOT** passed Fowles for No. 2 all-time during the game against Atlanta on September 9. Quigley reached a double-digit scoring total in 20 of 22 games this season. She shot a career-best 91.9% from the free throw line (minimum 10 attempts). The 12-year veteran donated \$920 off her 46 made 3-point field goals this season (\$20/per), which went directly to her hometown of Joiliet, Illinois' Salvation Army. Quigley and her fans raised \$3,234, which helped provide funding for a food pantry, Christmas/holiday presents, interview clothing for clients seeking new employment, one month of transportation for a client, a month of intensive casework for two clients and setting up utilities, purchasing food and furniture for clients as they begin a new life.

HEBARD FINISHES AMONG ELITE IN FG%: RUTHY HEBARD shot 68.2% from the floor this season, including going 15 straight games of 50% or better to close out the season. She scored a career-high 22 points on 9-12 shooting and pulled in eight rebounds in the regular season finale against Dallas. Her double-double on August 31 was the first to be done by a Sky rookie since Diamond DeShields scored 23 points and brought in 11 rebounds against the Atlanta Dream on June 27, 2018. Hebard is the ninth rookie in Sky franchise history to record a double-double.

COURTNEY VANDERSLOOT 2020 TIMELINE

July 26, Las Vegas Aces

- Became the Sky's all-time leader in seasons played with the team, her 10th season with the franchise
- She surpassed Tamera Young (nine seasons)
- · Reached a double-digit assist total for the 46th time in her career

July 28, Los Angeles Sparks

- Registered her 1,000th career field goal during 3rd quarter
- Finished with a double-digit assist total for the 47th time in her career
- Recorded 30th career double-double (11 points, 10 assists), first of the season

July 30, Minnesota Lynx

Passed Becky Hammon for fifth all-time on WNBA assists list.

August 4, Dallas Wings

- Posted a double figure assist total for the 48th time in her career
- Recorded her 31st career double-double (14 points, 10 assists), second of the season

August 6, Phoenix Mercury

- Led the Sky in scoring for the first time this season (21 points, a then season-high)
- Posted a double-digit scoring total for the third time in her last four games

August 8, Conecticut Sun

 Reached a double-digit assist total for the 49th time in her career (11 assists)

August 12, Phoenix Mercury

- Announced she will be donating \$10 for each assist she records this season to DonorsChoose in addition to her \$10 donated for every point as part of #SkyTakesAction
- Was first of six games where she shot 50% or better from the field and scored at least 12 points

August 18, Las Vegas Aces

- Tied Sky franchise record for most assists in a half (10). Contributed to 11 of the Sky's 18 field goals in the first half
- Reached a double-digit assist total for 50th time in her career
- 15 assists was her season-high and tied for her career-high (she's done it 3 times)
- Recorded her 32nd career double-double (15 points, 15 assists), third this season
- Became first player in WNBA history to have a 15+ point, 15+ assist, 5 rebound game

August 20, New York Liberty

- 10 assists gave her 25 over the last two games, the 5th time in her career she posted at least 25 assists in back-to-back games (Sky record)
- Posted a season-high four steals
- 19 points, 10 assists led to her 33rd career double-double, fourth this season

August 22, Indiana Fever

- Reached 1,800 assists with her second of the game
- One of five players in WNBA history to reach that feat (Sue Bird, Ticha Penicheiro, Diana Taurasi and Lindsay Whalen)
- Season-high 23 points

August 25, New York Liberty

- Scored a double-digit total for the seventh consecutive game
- Recorded at least nine assists for the fourth straight outing

August 29, Seattle Storm

Recorded at least nine assists for the fifth straight outing

August 31, Indiana Fever

- Set the WNBA record for most assists in a single game (18)
- 34th career double-double, fifth this season (13 points,18 assists) and 52nd game with a double-figure assist total

September 2, Minnesota Lynx

- 35th career double-double, sixth this season (13 points,12 assists) and 53rd game with a double-figure assist total
- Second time this seasons she went back-to-back games posting a double-double

September 4, Washington Mystics

- 36th career double-double, seventh this season (16 points,11 assists) and 54th game with a double-figure assist total

- 55th game with a double-figure assist total (15)
- Third time this season she recorded at least 15 assists

September 9, Atlanta Dream

- 56th game with a double-figure assist total (11)
- 37th career double-double (22 points, 11 assists), eighth this season
- Eighth career 20-point. 10-assist outing (1st this season)
- 10th straight game that she recorded at least nine assists

September 11, Dallas Wings

- 57th game with a double-figure assist total (12)
- 38th career double-double (15 points, 12 assists), ninth this season
