KEY RUNS

- The lead changed four times in the first quarter, including five ties.
- Atlanta ended the first quarter on a 5-0 run, trailing Chicago by one (21-20).
- Sky went on a 9-0 run early in the second quarter.
- Chicago continued its strong push toward the end of the first half, going on a 7-0 run and extending the margin to 14.
- Sky scored a quick ten points within the first minute and 45 seconds of the third quarter, going on an 8-0 run that put its lead to 18 (largest lead of the game).
- The Dream immediately responded with a 8-0 run to trim the Sky's lead back to 10. It continued its surge with an 11-0 run late in the third, cutting the Sky's lead to one.
- Atlanta went on a 10-0 run late in the fourth quarter, extending its lead to seven.

KEY STATS

- Only three players scored in the first quarter for Atlanta (**Laney**, **Courtney Williams** and **Carter**) while Chicago had six of its 10 active players score in the opening frame.
- Sky outscored the Dream 24-8 in the paint during the first half.
- Atlanta shot 6-7 from beyond the arc through the first two quarters, only making 14 total field goals.
- The Dream shot (4th quarter shooting)

CHICAGO NOTES

- Alexis Prince** scored her first point as a member of the Sky on a buzzer-beater to end the first half on a 3-point field goal.
- Kahleah Copper's** 17 points marked the 19th time in 21 games this season that she posted a double-digit scoring total. She pulled in at least seven rebounds for the fourth time in her last five games.
- Sky scored at least 50 points in a half for the fourth time this season during the first two quarters.
- Allie Quigley** extended her double-digit scoring streak to nine games off her 17-point performance. She has scored in double-figures in 20 of 21 games this season.
- Courtney Vandersloot** recorded her first 20-point, 10-assist game of the season tonight (22 points, 11 assists), the eighth of her career. It was her 10th straight game with at least nine assists, a new career-high (previously set at seven). In addition, it was her 37th career double-double (eighth this season) and 56th outing with a double-digit assist total.
- Ruthy Hebard** shot at least 50% from the floor for the 14th straight game, shooting 4-6 and scoring eight points.

ATLANTA NOTES

- Rookie **Chennedy Carter** scored 9 of the Dream's first 13 points, going a perfect 3-3 in the first 5.5 minutes of the game.
- Carter** has scored in double-digits in 11 of her first 14 career WNBA games.
- Betnijah Laney's** 24 points extended her double-digit scoring streak to four games, and 12 of her last 13.
