KEY RUNS

- Washington opened the first two and a half minutes of the game on a 12-7 run.
- The Mystics continued their strong first quarter by going on a 7-0 run which put their lead to 12 (28-16).
- Sky responded early in the second quarter, cutting the Mystics' lead to five (34-29) while on a 6-0 run.
- From the end of the third to the start of the fourth quarter, Washington went on an 8-0 run, extending its lead to 10.

KEY STATS

- Washington shot 14-22 from the floor (63.6%) during the first quarter, scoring six points off Chicago's four turnovers.
- 12 of the Mystics' first 15 field goals came from an assist.
- Sky trailed for the entire first half, with its largest deficit peaking at 12.
- Both teams shot below 30% from the 3-point line.

CHICAGO NOTES

- This was the third time this season the Sky's starting five featured **Courtney Vandersloot**, **Allie Quigley**, **Kahleah Copper**, **Gabby Williams** and **Cheyenne Parker**.
- **Vandersloot** and **Parker** scored half of the Sky's points through the first two quarters (20), shooting a combined 9-11 (81.8%) from the floor. The rest of the Sky shot 9-25 (36%) in the first half.
- With her 11 assists tonight, **Vandersloot** has gone eight straight games with at least nine assists. It was her 54th game with a double-digit assist total and 36th career double-double.
- **Quigley** extended her double-digit scoring streak to seven games off her 12-point performance. She has reached at least 10 points in 18 of 19 games this season.

WASHINGTON NOTES

- The Mystics came out strong in the opening frame, scoring 19 points in just over five minutes of play and making eight of their first 12 shots. **Myisha Hines-Allen** and **Leilani Mitchell** scored 14 of those 19 points.
- Washington went over four minutes in the second quarter without scoring.
- **Mitchell** recorded a season and career-high of 12 assists, including 20 points. The performance was her second career double-double.
