KEY RUNS

- There were eight lead changes and eight ties within the first quarter of tonight's game.
- Wings went on a 7-0 run within the first three and a half minutes of the second quarter.
- Chicago had a quick one-point lead halfway through the second quarter after going on an 8-0 run.
- Dallas regained a small lead late in the third quarter when it went on a 12-2 run.
- Sky opened the first three minutes of the fourth quarter on a 7-0 run, a combined 10-0 run that carried over from the 3rd quarter.
- The Wings answered with a 12-0 run, with five points scored by Arike Ogunbowale.
- Chicago finished the game on a 10-0 run.

KEY STATS

- Sky shot a perfect 10-10 from the free throw line in the first quarter, finishing the game 21-23.
- Chicago outscored Dallas 28-18 in the paint during the first half, and 50-34 for the game.
- Despite only having 8 healthy players (three off the bench), Wings' bench outscored the Sky's 17-11 through the first two quarters.
- Arike Ogunbowale made nine (9-10) of Dallas' 12 successful free throws.

CHICAGO NOTES

- **Ruthy Hebard** made her third consecutive start to close out the regular season. Her 9-12 shooting performance extended her streak of shooting better than 50% from the floor to 15 games.
- **Hebard** scored a career-high 22 points in 32 minutes of play.
- Courtney Vandersloot and Hebard scored 12 of the Sky's first 16 points, making four of the team's first five field goals.
- Chicago scored at least 50 points in a half for the fifth time this season, the second straight game as well.
- Kahleah Copper's 12 points tonight gave her 20 of 22 games this season with a double-digit scoring total. Copper and Allie Quigley each had 20 outings with a double-digit point total.
- Cheyenne Parker made a career-high three 3-point field goals, scoring 23 points on 8-12 shooting.

DALLAS NOTES

- The Wings' starting five of Marina Mabrey, Katie Lou Samuelson, Bella Alarie, Arike Ogunbowale and Tysha Harris was a new starting lineup for head coach Brian Agler and his team despite being in their 21st game.
- Former Sky players Katie Lou Samuelson and Astou Ndour played their 2nd game vs. Chicago since being traded in offseason.
- **Ogunbowale** reached a double-digit scoring total for the 21st time this season, which is the total number of games Dallas has played. It was her fourth game of 30 or more points.
