SKY GENERAL MANAGER & HEAD COACH JAMES WADE

On what Washington was able to do defensively against the Sky tonight:

"They played."

On adjusting mindset and not getting the results he's wanted:

"I just need us play harder, make an effort, and be able to sit down and guard somebody."

On his biggest focal point heading into Sunday's game vs. Los Angeles:

"You gotta be able to guard somebody."

On her individual performance and what was working for her:

"I've known from the first time we played against them that they couldn't guard me on the block, so I just made my presence known early. We just... It's unfortunate that we just lost tonight, but we have to find a way to come together on the court and get it done. But, we knew early to get the post presence was vital."

On what Washington did to have such a strong first quarter:

"They were the aggressor. They were aggressive from the beginning of the tip, and we weren't, and that's what has been hurting us past the past few games, is how we start."

On what message she wants to convey to rest of her team:

"That we just have to get back to finding ourselves. We just talked to the locker room and our general [Courntey Vandersloot] Sloot was just like, 'This sucks, yeah, this is a horrible feeling, but we have to we have to find our identity again and get back to playing Chicago basketball."
