She is also only the third player ever to do so in their age-35 season or older. Diggins paired with teammate Kamilla Cardoso to become the first duo in WNBA history to each record double-doubles in an opener. Diggins reached 5,500 career points in Saturday's matchup.

TYLER MARSH

Head Coach

Marsh joins the Sky with a plethora of coaching experience as the franchise's ninth head coach in history. He spent the past two seasons as an assistant coach and head of player development with the Las Vegas Aces, helping lead the team to back-to-back WNBA Championships in 2022 and 2023 and a Commissioner's Cup Championship win in 2022. In the three years on the Aces coaching staff under Head Coach Becky Hammon, Marsh helped coach the Aces to three straight playoff berths from 2022-24.

Prior to his time with the Aces, Marsh held a similar role as an assistant coach on the NBA side with the Indiana Pacers from 2020-22 under head coaches Rick Carlisle and Nate Bjorkgren. Before Indiana, Marsh won an NBA Championship under Head Coach Nick Nurse in 2019 as the Toronto Raptors' assistant video coordinator/player development coach.

Before the NBA, Marsh also coached in the NBA D League — now the G League — with the Fort Wayne Mad Ants from 2016-17, Bakersfield Jam from 2014-15 (currently the Motor City Cruise), Iowa Energy from 2013-14 (currently the Iowa Wolves) and the Rio Grande Valley Vipers from 2012-13.

The Miami, Florida native also played collegiately at Alabama Birmingham from 2006-08 and Birmingham-Southern from 2008-10.

Marsh is no stranger to coaching, as his father, Donnie Marsh, has been coaching basketball for decades. Donnie was recently an assistant coach for the men's basketball team at Detroit-Mercy. Marsh also coached under his father as an assistant coach for the Alabama A&M men's basketball team during the 2017-18 season.

Marsh is married to his wife, Kiara, and they have a son together named Jaxxon and are expecting another child.

LATRICIA TRAMMELL

Assistant Coach

The Chicago Sky announced Latricia Trammell joined as an assistant on head coach Tyler Marsh's staff on Nov. 24, 2025. Trammell joins the Sky with eight seasons of WNBA coaching experience, including two years as the head coach of the Dallas Wings from 2023-24. She was most recently a special assistant on Lynne Roberts' staff in Los Angeles during the 2025 season. In Trammell's first year as head coach in 2023, the Wings won 22 games, their most since relocating to Dallas in 2016. Their 22-win season was also the franchise's most since its last Finals appearance as the Detroit Shock in 2018.

In addition to regular season success, Trammell's Wings won a first-round playoff series in 2023, their first and only since relocating to Dallas. The Wings had a potent offense in both seasons under Trammell, ranking third in points per game and offensive rating in 2023, and ranking fourth in points per game and first in pace the following year. For her efforts, Trammell was runner-up for Coach of the Year in 2023 and oversaw players earn one Most Improved Player and two All-WNBA selections in her two seasons there.

Trammell began her coaching career at the high school level before making the jump to college as an assistant at Texas Women's University in 2003. She got her first collegiate head coaching job at Western State from 2007-12 before returning to Oklahoma City University in 2012, where she also previously served as an assistant. In three years with Oklahoma City, Trammell compiled an 85-10 record, winning the NAIA Championship in each of her last two seasons there.

She moved to the professional ranks as an assistant for the San Antonio Stars (now Las Vegas Aces) in 2017 before spending 2019-22 in the same role for Los Angeles. While with Los Angeles in 2019-22, Trammell again helped oversee several star-caliber seasons. Sparks players earned four All-WNBA selections, one Defensive Player of the Year, two Defensive Player of the Year runner-ups, two All-Defensive Team selections and one top-three Most Valuable Player finish during Trammell's tenure. The Sparks also did not finish with lower than a top-four defensive rating in each of her first three seasons there. With Trammell serving as special assistant of the Sparks in 2025, Los Angeles finished the year ranked second in points per game and first in pace.



RENA WAKAMA

Assistant Coach

The Sky hired Rena Wakama as assistant coach on March 25, 2025. Wakama recently led the Nigerian Women's National Team to new heights after gaining success in the 2024 Paris Olympics this past summer. She was hired as the Nigerian Women's National Basketball Head Coach in June 2023 and became the first female coach to ever win the Women's AfroBasketball title in August 2023. She led Nigeria to the quarterfinals stage, where no African team, men or women, were able to make it out of the group stage prior to that. As one of the youngest head coaches in Olympic history, Wakama was awarded Best Coach by FIBA after her achievements in Paris. The Raleigh, North Carolina native joined the coaching staff at Tulane in 2024 as an assistant coach.



JHARED SIMPSON

Assistant Coach

The Sky hired Simpson as an assistant on April 17, 2026. Simpson spent last WNBA season with the Dallas Wings as Director of Player Development. He has over 15 years of experience coaching across the WNBA, NBA and NBA G League. Prior to the Wings, he spent four seasons as an assistant coach with the Indiana Fever. Before that, Simpson held assistant coaching roles with the Northern Arizona Suns and Fort Wayne Mad Ants (now the Boom) in the G League. He was a video coordinator with the Indiana Pacers. Prior to making the jump to the professional basketball ranks as a coach, Simpson was an assistant coach at his alma mater, Wheeling Jesuit University. He holds both undergraduate and graduate degrees from Wheeling Jesuit.



KELLY FARIS

Assistant Coach

Faris was hired by the Sky on April 17, 2026. Faris comes to the Sky after being an assistant coach with the NBA G League's Noblesville Boom. She played collegiately for the University of Connecticut, helping contribute to two national championships during her time there. Faris experienced a successful professional career, playing in the WNBA for the Connecticut Sun from 2013-16 before enjoying overseas stints in Hungary, Australia, Israel, Austria and Iceland. After her playing career, Faris served as an assistant coach for the women's basketball teams at Marian University (2023-24) and Brebeuf Jesuit Preparatory School in Indianapolis (2024-25) before landing with the Boom. Faris often engages in leadership through community work and aids with the NBA's Basketball Without Borders program.

PLAYER PRO CONNECTIONS

Gabby Williams was drafted No. 4 overall pick in the 2018 WNBA draft to the Chicago Sky. She spent three seasons with the Sky and tied for sixth for Defensive Player of the Year in her rookie season. She averaged 6.8 points, 3.5 assists and 2.5 steals in her three seasons with Chicago.

Azurá Stevens, **Kayla Thornton** and **Skylar Diggins** were teammates during the 2018 season with the Dallas Wings.

Thornton and **Courtney Vandersloot** were teammates on the Liberty together and won New York's first-ever WNBA championship in 2024.

PLAYER COLLEGIATE/HOMETOWN CONNECTIONS

Veronica Burton played for Northwestern's women's basketball team located in Evanston, Illinois from 2018-22. During her collegiate career, she was named Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year for two consecutive seasons.

Kamilla Cardoso and **Laeticia Amihere** played together at the University of South Carolina and went on to win the 2022 national championship. Both went on to become first-round draft picks in back-to-back WNBA drafts (2023 and 2024).

DiJonai Carrington and **Ashten Prechtel** played together for one season at Stanford University.

Tiffany Hayes and assistant coach **Kelly Faris** played together at the University of Connecticut and won two national championships during their collegiate career. The duo was selected in the 2012 and 2013 WNBA drafts and competed against one another for four seasons.

COACHING PRO CONNECTIONS

Tyler Marsh and **Natalie Nakase** worked alongside one another as assistant coaches for the Las Vegas Aces from 2022-24. This is their fourth time meeting up as head coaches.

BREAKOUT YOUTH POTENTIAL

Second-year **Kamilla Cardoso** finished her sophomore season with the Sky averaging 13.6 points, 8.5 rebounds, and 2.5 assists per game. Cardoso set a career-high 15 rebounds and 27 points in the 2025 season. The Sky also acquired **Ricke Jackson** in the offseason, who was taken one pick after Cardoso in the 2024 WNBA Draft. She earned an MVP vote with stellar play last season and was on the 2024 All-Rookie Team alongside Cardoso. After playing in the SEC against each other and now in training camp with each other, both players are primed for breakout years with the Sky.

After both Cardoso and Jackson were taken at Nos. 3 and 4 in the 2024 draft, Jacy Sheldon was picked fifth overall. The Sky also traded for her, where she will be expected to play a major role on and off the ball. She shot 41.2% from three while with Connecticut last season and is the perfect piece to fit alongside Cardoso and Jackson.

STARS IN THE SKY

The Sky made numerous splash signings in the backcourt in 2026, and now roster three players who rank in the top 10 of the WNBA's all-time assists list in **Courtney Vandersloot**, **Skylar Diggins** and **Natasha Cloud**. Diggins, a Notre Dame native, is returning close to home to help lift the Sky to new heights

Diggins added to her All-Star repertoire with another nod in 2025 after averaging 15.5 points and 6.0 assists. In her age-35 season, Diggins is seeking her eighth All-Star nod and will pair with championship-winning guards in Vandersloot and Cloud to lead the Sky to glory.

Cloud signed with the Sky on May 4 and brings all-defensive guard play and an elite passer to the mix for the Sky.

Vandersloot became the Sky's all-time leading scorer in the 2025 season despite being limited to seven games due to injury. She is on track for a return during the 2026 season.

DISTRIBUTING THE ROCK

Vandersloot is second in career assists (2,887), 347 behind career leader Sue Bird. She is over 1,000 assists ahead of the closest active player (Chelsea Gray - 1,870). Vandersloot is also the WNBA career leader in assists per game (6.6). Second is Sabrina Ionescu at 5.9.

Diggins ranks eighth all-time in career assists with 1768. She is fourth among active players in assists behind Vandersloot, Chelsea Gray (1870) and Alyssa Thomas (1820). She ranks sixth all-time in assists per game at 5.3.

Cloud is ninth all-time in career assists with 1733. She is fifth among active players. Cloud ranks fifth all-time in assists per game at 5.3

The trio also each rank in the top eight all time in career points-assists double-doubles. Vandersloot is first all-time with 62 (25 ahead of second-place Alyssa Thomas), Natasha Cloud is sixth all time with 17 and Skylar Diggins is eighth all time with 16.

2021 REUNION

Sloot is also reuniting with old teammate, **Azurá Stevens**. The two players helped the Sky win their first championship in franchise history in 2021, with both players providing crucial plays and games en route to the chip.

NEW HEIGHTS

The Sky now boast one of the tallest frontcourts in the league with Kamilla Cardoso and **Azurá Stevens**. Cardoso stands at 6-foot-7 while Stevens is 6-foot-6. Stevens brings a stretch ability next to Cardoso that will propel the Sky. Stevens took 4.4 three-point attempts per game last season, shooting 38.1% from three. For her efforts, she finished second in Most Improved Player voting and will look to build on a breakout season in familiar territory after playing with the Sky from 2020-22.

ROOKIE DEBUTS

Sky rookies **Gabriela Jaquez**, **Sydney Taylor** and **Aicha Coulibaly** made their WNBA debuts in the Sky's first preseason game on April 25 against Phoenix and will look to make their official debuts in the regular season opener. Jaquez was fifth overall in the 2026 draft, coming off a national championship victory. She scored 12 points in her first preseason game.

Taylor signed a training camp contract on April 13. Taylor led the Sky in the second preseason game against Atlanta with 23 points, going 7 for 13 from the field in just 17 minutes of action. She made the Sky's opening night 12-player roster.

The Sky signed Coulibaly to one of the first developmental contracts in team history alongside **Maddy Westfeld**. Coulibaly was selected in the second round of the 2025 WNBA draft by the Sky. She started in both of Chicago's preseason games. In just 30 minutes combined, she totaled nine points, three steals and three blocks. In the preseason opener against Phoenix, she made it to the free-throw line five times, knocking down all of her attempts.

FREE AGENT MOVES

Chicago added guards **Jacy Sheldon** and **DiJonai Carrington** in the offseason. Carrington has a Most Improved Player award, All-Defensive nods, and she tied for fourth for Defensive Player of the Year all in the 2024 season. She appeared in 20 games for the Dallas Wings in the 2025 season, starting in 13 of those. She averaged 10.4 points, 5.1 rebounds and 1.8 assists in 24.9 minutes per game. She then appeared in 11 games for the Lynx after being traded midseason. She averaged 8.6 points, 2.1 rebounds and 1.2 steals per game there.

In the 2025 season, Sheldon appeared in 28 games with Connecticut including 17 starts. She averaged 7.5 points, 2.0 assists, 1.9 rebounds and 1.0 steals while shooting 47.0% from the field and 41.2% from three-point range. She scored 10 or more points in 11 games, including a high of 16 points on July 9 against Seattle. Had a high seven assists on May 27 against Dallas to go along with four steals.

SKYLINES

TYLER'S SECOND SEASON

Head coach **Tyler Marsh** heads into his second season in the league. His first season saw the team rank toward the top of the league in unique starting lineups used with 16. This was mostly due to games missed due to injury. Vandersloot was limited to seven games and their combined top eight in minutes played missed a combined 68 games to injury.

Marsh now employs a new-look roster filled with top-of-the-line veteran talent and young pieces who can make an impact. Additionally, he retained Rena Wakama, who has taken the Nigerian National Team to new heights, and added assistants **Latricia Trammell**, **Jhared Simpson** and **Kelly Faris**. Trammell is the former head coach of the Wings who is responsible for the franchise's last playoff appearance while Simpson and Faris are former G League coaches. Faris is a former WNBA player and UConn player.

AN IMPRESSIVE OFFSEASON

Of the Sky's 12 active roster players this season, only **Kamilla Cardoso**, **Courtney Vandersloot**, **Rachel Banham** and **Elizabeth Williams** return from the 2025 season. The Sky added an external 70.4 points, 23.3 rebounds, 18.3 assists, 6.2 steals, 3.2 blocks and 8.0 three-pointers in 2025 production from their six non-rookie external additions. Just from those six players, their numbers in 2025 combined would rank in the middle of full team production in 2025.

In addition, general manager **Jeff Pogliocca** retained 10.0 points, 3.1 rebounds and 5.3 assists worth of production from the three players he re-signed and Cardoso.

That doesn't factor in rookies **Gabriela Jaquez**, undrafted rookie find **Sydney Taylor** and 2025 second-round pick **Aicha Coulibaly** or fellow returner **Maddy Westbeld**.

RETURNERS MAKING CONTRIBUTIONS

Chicago re-signed **Elizabeth Williams** and **Rachel Banham**. The Sky also signed 2025 second-round pick **Maddy Westbeld** to a developmental contract for the 2026 season. The three players are returning to the Sky to build off their chemistry from the previous season.

Williams gave the Sky a major spark coming off the bench last year in a return season from injury. In just 21.1 minutes per game, she averaged 8.5 points, 5.2 rebounds, 0.7 steals and 0.9 blocks. Williams' statistics were actually among the best per-minute production she's had in her career. Per 36 minutes entering Sept. 11, she averaged 14.5 points (career high per 36), 8.9 rebounds, 3.1 assists (second highest per 36), 1.2 steals and 1.5 blocks. She scored a season-high 16 points on June 22 against Atlanta, 14 of which came in the first half. Williams scored a season-high 20 points against the Mystics on July 8, along with a career-high 17 field goal attempts (making nine of them, also a season high). Williams secured her first double-double of the 2025 season on Aug. 3 against Phoenix when she recorded 15 points and 15 rebounds, both of which led the team.

Banham earned her first start of the season for the Sky on June 10. Banham reached 300 career made three-pointers on June 15 against Connecticut. Scored 10 points and four assists in her second start of the year on June 22. Banham knocked down three three-pointers on June 29 against Los Angeles and scored 13 points to help guide the Sky to a victory. Her 58 total threes after her 27th game passed her career high for total threes in a season (previous: 57 in 2022 across 36 games). There were 17 games left in the season at the point she accomplished these feats. She wound up finishing with the second-most threes in a single season for the Sky last year.

In Westbeld's rookie season, she appeared in 26 games, averaging 4.1 points and 2.4 rebounds while shooting 39.5% from the three in just 13.6 minutes. She had her best career game for the Sky in their final game of the season. Westbeld scored 25 points, seven rebounds and three assists against New York, knocking down 8 of 12 shots overall and 5 of 6 three-point attempts.

E-WILL IN THE RECORD BOOKS

Williams enter the 2026 season second among active players in offensive rebounds (757) behind Nneka Ogumike (850). She ranks 15th all-time in offensive rebounds. She also enters the season third among active players in blocks (483) behind A'ja Wilson (533) and Brittney Griner (859). She ranks 11th all-time in blocks.

DIGGINS MOVING UP

Diggins enter the season fourth among active players in free throws made (1,422) behind Breanna Stewart (1,429), A'ja Wilson (1,458) and DeWanna Bonner (1,938). She ranks 12th all time in free throws made. She also enters the season fourth among active players in free throws attempted (1,687) behind Stewart (1,709), Wilson (1,775) and Bonner (2,259). She is 15th all time in free throws attempted.

CARDOSO'S HOT STREAK

Cardoso had an excellent finish to the 2025 season, averaging 16.1 points, 8.8 rebounds, 3.6 assists and 1.7 blocks in her last 13 games of the year to go along with four double-doubles in those games.

SKYLINES

HISTORIC NIGHT IN SEASON OPENER

Kamilla Cardoso and **Skylar Diggins** made history in the big win for the Sky, becoming the first duo in WNBA history to each record double-doubles in a season opener. This is also just the third time in Sky history the feat has been accomplished. This victory marks the second-most points in a Sky season opener ever and the Sky are out to a 1-0 start for the first time in three years.

Cardoso recorded a 22-point, 14-rebound double-double, one rebound shy of her career high. Diggins finished the night with a near-triple-double, going for 21 points, 11 rebounds and seven assists along with two blocks and a steal.

Diggins accomplished her 5,500 career points in Sky's last matchup. She needs 34 more rebounds to hit her 1,000 career rebound milestone.

ROOKIE DEBUTS

Sky rookies **Gabriela Jaquez**, **Sydney Taylor** and **Aicha Coulibaly** made their WNBA debuts in Sky's first game of the season on May 9 against the Portland Fire.

Jaquez was selected No. 5 overall pick by the Chicago Sky in the 2026 WNBA draft. Jaquez appeared in her first professional career start for the Sky in the latest matchup. In just 32 minutes, she recorded career firsts of 10 points, seven rebounds, two assists and two steals.

Taylor and Coulibaly appeared in Sky's season opener. Both combined 10 minutes. Coulibaly tallied two rebounds and one assist.

SKY DEBUTS

Jacy Sheldon and **Rickea Jackson** starred in their Sky debuts in the latest matchup.

Jackson was one of three players that recorded 19 or more points in the season opener. She went 8 for 10 from the free-throw line, both of which tied career highs. She added three assists and one block.

Sheldon was one of six players that recorded double figures in Saturday night's matchup. She had a strong defensive performance against the Fire. She scored 13 points, four rebounds, four assists and recorded a career-high three blocks.

Sheldon is 33 points shy of reaching 500 career points.

RETURNERS MAKING CONTRIBUTIONS

Elizabeth Williams and **Rachel Banham** contributed to the Sky's latest victory.

Williams came off the bench for the Sky and had a clutch stretch in the fourth quarter against the Fire. She scored eight of her points in the last period. She recorded 10 points, going 4 of 5 from the field, two assists, one rebound and a block in just 15 minutes. Banham notched three points and two assists.

Banham is 10th all-time on Sky 3-PT list. She needs 11 (116) to surpass Diamond DeShields (126) for eighth on Sky's all-time list.

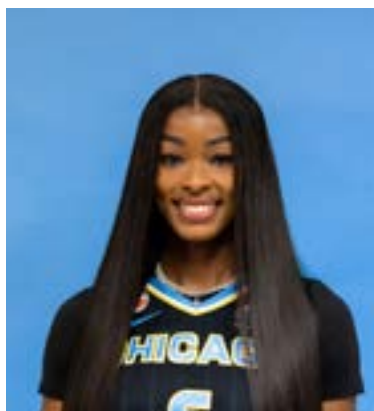
