Kelsey Mitchell's 20 points led a 55-point bench contribution as Indiana overcame a 20-point deficit to hand the Lynx their fourth straight loss, 86-75, on Saturday night at Bankers Life Fieldhouse. Minnesota led by as many as 11 in the opening quarter before taking a 23-19 advantage into the second, when Lexie Brown's 3-pointer ignited a barrage of 18 unanswered points that put the Lynx on top 41-21. Natalie Achonwa converted a three-point play to pull the Fever within 10 at halftime and Kelsey Mitchell's trey capped a 12-2 start to the third period that knotted the score at 50-50. Indiana then took control with a 13-0 surge as Minnesota was held scoreless for five minutes and fell behind 67-59 entering the fourth. The Lynx sliced the deficit to two points on three separate occasions before Stephanie Mavunga and Tiffany Mitchell teamed up for nine consecutive points to give Indiana its largest lead at 82-71 with 1:45 to play. Kelsey Mitchell handed out a career-high nine assists and Tiffany Mitchell added 17 points for the Fever. Minnesota was led by 17 points from Sylvia Fowles and 14 apiece from Napheesa Collier and Temi Fagbenle.

Previous Game: Wednesday, July 24 – Washington 79, Minnesota 71

Kristi Toliver scored 20 of her season-high 32 points in the first half and Washington withstood a late Lynx rally to notch a 79-71 victory on July 24 in front of a record Target Center crowd of 17,934. Toliver netted eight consecutive points to put the Mystics on top to stay at 14-9 and the margin reached 26-16 at the end of one quarter. Washington tallied the first nine points of the second period to extend its lead to 19 but Sylvia Fowles sparked an 8-0 finish to the half that pulled Minnesota to within 44-32. The Lynx could get no closer in the third while the Mystics grabbed their largest lead at 65-45 on Tianna Hawkins' layup at the 1:47 mark. Lexie Brown's 3-pointer at the buzzer narrowed Minnesota's deficit to 65-53, but again the comeback bid stalled. After Natasha Cloud rebuilt Washington's lead to 19 midway through the fourth, Fowles and Stephanie Talbot teamed up for 12 unanswered points that got the Lynx within 76-69, but Emma Meesseman's jumper put the game out of reach. Brown tallied 19 points for Minnesota while Fowles (18 points, 12 rebounds) and Napheesa Collier (15 points, 11 boards) registered double-doubles.

LYNX TRAX: Minnesota jumped in front by 20 in the 2nd quarter before falling 86-75 on Saturday at Indiana, the largest lead the Lynx have ever let slip away in a loss... Minnesota headed into All-Star Weekend by dropping a 79-71 decision vs. Washington on July 24... The Lynx have lost their last four, tumbling to 10-11 on the season; the drought began with a 90-79 home defeat vs. Seattle on July 17 and continued with a 79-74 loss at Las Vegas on July 21... Minnesota picked up its sixth victory in eight starts with the 75-62 decision vs. Phoenix on July 14, reaching the season's midpoint with a 10-7 record... It's the ninth straight year (12th overall) the Lynx have won at least 10 games in the first half, topped by a 15-2 mark in 2017... Atlanta claimed a 60-53 win over the Lynx on July 12 at State Farm Arena, reversing an 85-68 road loss on July 2; the defeat halted Minnesota's second three-game winning streak of 2019... The Lynx edged Chicago, 73-72, on July 10 at Wintrust Arena, their second win over the Sky this season (89-71 on May 25 at Target Center)... Minnesota began its three-game road swing with the 74-71 win at Connecticut on July 6, ending a five-game series drought vs. the Sun... Dallas rallied from 14 points down in the 3rd quarter to edge the Lynx, 89-86, on June 30, stopping a 12-game series drought dating to July 19, 2015... Minnesota halted its previous four-game skid of 2019 by defeating New York, 92-83, on June 22...

MARGINAL INFORMATION: Saturday's 11-point spread at Indiana is Minnesota's second double-figure loss this year... Connecticut has also suffered two such losses to date; every other team has at least three... The July 10 win at Chicago boosted Minnesota's record to 4-1 in one-possession games (decided by three points or fewer), tying the league's most wins in that category (Seattle 4-2)... The Lynx went 1-3 in one-possession games last year and 3-2 in 2017; *the club single-season high for close wins is six, set in 2004...* Minnesota opened a 21-point cushion in the 3rd quarter of the July 2 win over Atlanta; all-time, they're 123-1 in games they've built a lead of 20+ points (4-1 in 2019)... Before that victory, each of the Lynx' previous 10 games were decided by single-digit margins...

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Seattle's 90 points on July 17 are the most allowed by the Lynx in 2019; Los Angeles (June 8) and Dallas (June 30) both tallied 89... The Storm are the only team to shoot better than 50% vs. Minnesota this season and have done so twice (59.3% on June 4 in Everett, 53.2% on July 17)... Minnesota limited Phoenix to 38.7% on July 14, its fourth straight game holding an opponent below 40% from the floor... *It's the first time the Lynx have strung together four consecutive sub-40% defensive efforts since compiling* a run of six in a row in July 2013... Atlanta's 33.8% effort on July 12 is Minnesota's top defensive percentage of 2019... Phoenix finished with 62 points on July 14, the sixth time the Lynx have kept their opponent under 70 points (third time in eight July starts)... The Lynx currently rank 6th in scoring defense (75.3 ppg) and 3rd in Defensive Rating (95.6)...

GOING TO EXTREMES: The 53-point total in Atlanta on July 12 is Minnesota's 2nd-lowest since the WNBA went to its current format of four quarters and a 24-second shot clock in 2006 (51 vs. Indiana, June 6, 2010)... The Lynx also posted a season low for FG accuracy in Atlanta (35.4%); the previous low (37.2%) was set in the July 10 victory at Chicago... The 92 points vs. New York on June 22 are the Lynx' single-game best since the 110-87 victory over Chicago on Sept. 1, 2017... <u>Minnesota is 9th in the WNBA in scoring (75.8 ppg), 3rd in FG accuracy (43.6%) and 9th in Offensive Rating (96.1)</u>... The Lynx shot a season-high 51.6% (33-for-64) from the floor June 22 vs. New York; since the start of 2011, Minnesota is 74-2 when topping 50%... The Lynx finished 21-for-30 from the line vs. New York, only the 10th time in nine years they've attempted 30+ free throws (10-0 in those games)...

DEPT. OF THE INTERIOR: The Lynx outscored New York 50-40 in the paint on June 22, the 20th time in team history they've tallied 50+ paint points (the first since scoring 52 vs. Chicago on Sept. 1, 2017 in St. Paul); Minnesota is 17-3 in those contests... <u>The Lynx rank 2nd in paint scoring (36.4 ppg)</u> behind Las Vegas <u>and also stand 4th in fewest paint points allowed (31.1 ppg)</u> behind Las Vegas, Seattle and Dallas... Connecticut outscored the Lynx 44-38 in the paint on June 14, the most points by a Minnesota opponent at home since Phoenix tallied 46 on June 7, 2016... It's one of six times this year the Lynx have been outscored in the paint (most recently 34-32 by Seattle on July 17); they're 2-4 in those contests... Minnesota finished 5-8 last season when facing a paint deficit (5-3 in 2017)...

TURNOVER TIDBITS: Indiana tallied 30 points off the Lynx' season-high 22 TOs on Saturday, just the eighth time in franchise history Minnesota has allowed 30+ in that category... <u>The Lynx are averaging 18.8 TOs per game in their last five</u>, after slicing that figure to 12.2 per game in the previous five... Minnesota netted 34 points from 21 Seattle TOs on July 17, equaling the 2nd-highest single-game point total in franchise history (35 vs. Los Angeles, July 26, 2011)... The Lynx committed just eight TOs at Dallas on June 30, tying their fewest since a six-TO night vs. New York on July 15, 2016... Minnesota ranks last in the WNBA in TOs per game (16.8) but 2nd in TOs forced per game (16.4); they lead the league in points off TOs (18.2 ppg) and rank 10th in points allowed from TOs (16.4 ppg)...

LYNX TRAX: Minnesota wrapped up its 20th WNBA season with an 18-16 record and the #7 playoff seed, only the second time in the past eight years the Lynx haven't won 25+ games and carried a top-two seed into the postseason... Minnesota strung together back-to-back 27-7 marks in 2011 and 2012, went 26-8 in 2013, 25-9 in 2014, 22-12 in 2015, a club-record 28-6 in 2016 and 27-7 last summer... Still, adding last year's 18 victories into the mix, the Lynx have established all-time WNBA marks for most wins in eight (200), nine (213) and 10 (227) consecutive seasons; they already held the records for six- (155) and seven- (182) year stretches... Minnesota tumbled to a 3-6 start in 2018 (including its first four-game losing streak since 2010) before reeling off seven consecutive victories (June 16-July 1) to climb to 2nd place in the WNBA standings... The Lynx later entered the All-Star Break at 15-10 and on a three-game winning streak, but lost six of its first eight August starts before regrouping to beat Washington in the Aug. 19 regular season finale at Target Center... That victory stopped a three-game home losing streak, their longest such drought since a four-game slide in July 2010... Minnesota went 9-8 both at Target Center and on the road, having entered 2018 a combined 103-16 (.866) in its previous seven years at home... The Lynx officially clinched their eighth playoff berth in a row with the Aug. 9 triumph at Las Vegas, matching the third-longest streak of postseason appearances in WNBA history... Los Angeles also advanced in eight straight years (1999-2006) while Indiana (2005-2016) owns the longest such run of success at 12 years and Seattle (2004-2013) enjoyed a decade-long string of trips to the postseason...
