Sweet 16 Rematch

The last time Dream guard Chennedy Carter and Wings guard Arike Ogunbowale met was in the 2019 NCAA Championship Sweet 16. Carter put up a season-high 35 points, going 7-of-12 from the arc, while Ogunbowale scored a career-high 34 points. Carter and the Aggies fell to the eventual National Runner-Up Fighting Irish 80-87.

Pro Tigers

Dream guard Blake Dietrick and Wings forward Bella Alarie – both Princeton graduates – are the only Ivy League players in the WNBA this season. If both players enter the game, it will mark the first instance in league history two Princeton grads went head-to-head.

The only other times two Ivy League graduates met in a WNBA game were the four matchups between Dietrick and Temi Fagbenle, as Fagbenle graduated from Harvard (although she was drafted out of USC, where she attended grad school).

2020 Wubble Season at IMG Academy

The league's 24th season will take place in Bradenton, Florida at IMG Academy, the Official Home of the 2020 WNBA season, and will include a 22-game schedule for each of its 12 teams. The Dream's regular season will run from July 26 to September 11, and will be followed by a standard-format Playoff series.

Opening Weekend Dedicated to Black Lives Matter Movement

During the opening weekend, when all 12 teams will be in action, all aspects of the game and player outfitting will be designed to affirm Black Lives Matter and honor victims of police brutality and racial violence.

Team uniforms will display Breonna Taylor's name as WNBA players raise awareness and seek justice for the women and girls who have been the forgotten victims of police brutality and racial violence. Players will individually have the option to continue to wear the placard with Breonna Taylor's name for subsequent games. Additionally, throughout the season, players will wear warm-up shirts that display "Black Lives Matter" on the front and "Say Her Name" on the back. "Black Lives Matter" will also be prominently displayed on courts during games.

WNBPA Messaging Around Actions with the Anthem

"We are standing united across the league during opening weekend to make a statement about how the anthem does not represent freedom, justice and liberty for all Americans. We will continue to protest in varius forms."

Returning Players

Dream veteran center Elizabeth Williams and forward Monique Billings are the only returning players on Atlanta's roster this season. They are joined by 11 new players, three of which are rookies. Blake Dietrick played for the Dream in 2018 and returned for training camp in 2019, but was waived by Atlanta and picked up by Seattle for the 2019 season.

Only one other team* in WNBA history has returned two or fewer players from the previous season - Phoenix in 2017 (returned Diana Taurasi and Brittney Griner).

Career Milestones

Elizabeth Williams needs 38 blocks to surpass Erika de Souza (295) as Atlanta's career blocks leader.

Hollywood

Atlanta has added scoring and swagger in Chennedy Carter, the Dream's first top-four pick since Angel McCoughtry was selected No. 1 overall in 2009.

The standout was one of the most dynamic scorers in NCAA D-I during her three-year career at Texas A&M. She scored at least 26 points in all six of her career NCAA Tournament games, leading the Aggies to the NCAA Sweet 16 twice. Among players with at least five NCAA Tournament games played, Carter ranks third in scoring average at 31.0 points per game, trailing only Elena Delle Donne (34.4 PPG at Delaware) and Sheryl Swoopes (31.7 PPG at Texas Tech).

She is a second cousin of WNBA champ Jia Perkins and the god-daughter of former NBA champion Jason Terry.

Said A&M coach, Gary Blair: "There are not too many kids today who are junkies of the game... She's a junkie. All she is doing is watching basketball and talking about the game. If Luka (Doncic) has done another special shot, I guarantee I will see it the next day at practice, or something from [Michael] Westbrook. She studies that."

What Happened to Breonna Taylor?

Shortly after midnight on March 13, Louisville police officers, executing a search warrant, used a battering ram to enter the apartment of Breonna Taylor, a 26-year-old African-American emergency room technician.

Ms. Taylor and her boyfriend, Kenneth Walker, had been in bed, but got up when they heard a loud banging at the door. After a brief exchange, Mr. Walker fired his gun. The police also fired several shots, striking Ms. Taylor.

Mr. Walker told investigators that Ms. Taylor coughed and struggled to breathe for at least five minutes after she was shot, according to The Louisville Courier Journal. She received no medical attention for more than 20 minutes after she was struck, The Courier Journal reported, citing dispatch logs.¹

What's Up With the Police Report?

The Louisville Police Department's incident report listed Breonna Taylor's injuries as "none" despite her being shot at least eight times, and showed that police had not forced their way into their apartment, though they used a battering ram to break the door open. ²

Connecticut South

Shekinna Stricklen and Courtney Williams, who helped Connecticut reach the WNBA Finals last season, are new to Atlanta but not to Nicki Collen, who spent 2015–17 as an assistant with the Sun. Last year, Stricklen ranked third in the league in made threes (76) and Williams was 20th in scoring (13.2 ppg).

Lady Vols

Glory Johnson and Shekinna Stricklen will appear on the same roster for the first time in their professional careers this summer. The last time the duo played together was at the University of Tennessee, when they led the Lady Vols to back-to-back Elite Eight appearances

and three-straight SEC Tournament Championships under legendary coach Pat Summitt. Stricklen and Johnson were selected second and fourth overall, respectively, in the 2012 WNBA Draft.

Laney Finding Her Place

After spending the first four years of her career with Indiana and Chicago, guard Betnijah (buh-NIGH-jah) Laney is finding her place with Atlanta. Originally brought in for her defensive mindset, she has proven herself to be a strong offensive player and was a standout for the Dream during training camp.

"The scouting report on Betnijah Laney throughout her career so far is that she can't shoot it," head coach Nicki Collen said to the media during camp. "She's a defender, she's an energy player. It's just not what we've seen so far in camp, so to see her do it in a five-on-five setting, to make open shots, to attack, to score around the rim, that was a really pleasant surprise. ... She's really developed her game and becoming a better all-around player, especially at the offensive end."

Erica McCall Reps the A in the Bubble

The Dream picked up McCall after being granted an emergency hard-ship waiver during training camp. As the younger sister of Connecticut forward Dewanna Bonner, the pair is the only sister duo playing in the league this season.

Don't More White Americans Get Killed By Police in the US?

Yes, but why are you okay with that? In 2019, data of all police killings in the country compiled by Mapping Police Violence, black Americans were nearly three times more likely to die from police than white Americans. Other statistics showed that black Americans were nearly one-and-a-half times more likely to be unarmed before their death.³

Offseason Moves

Atlanta had the most active offseason of any team in the league this year, aquiring 10 new players through Free Agency, the Draft and trades prior to coming to Florida. The Dream traded for Courtney Williams from Connecticut and Kalani Brown from Los Angeles, along with a talented crop of Free Agents that included Glory Johnson and Shekinna Stricklen. "Dream fans should be blown away by their team's offseason. Buy stock now," – Matt Ellentuck, SB Nation

Dream Draft Four in 2020 WNBA Draft

The Dream drafted four players in the 2020 WNBA Draft, headlined by guard Chennedy Carter out of Texas A&M with the No. 4 overall selection. Collen picked Texas Tech forward Brittany Brewer with the No. 17 overall selection (second round) – Carter and Brewer both signed contracts with the team for the 2020 season.

Collen also selected Oregon State guard Mikayla Pivec and Clemson forward Kobi Thornton with the No. 25 and 27 picks (third round), respectively.

A Bold New Era

Atlanta implemented a rebrand prior to the 2020 season, unveiling new logos and colors for the first time since its inaugural season (2008). The Dream also has new uniforms, a new mascot

MRY 24, 2019

ATLANTA (AP) One year after a stout defense helped Atlanta advance to the WNBA semifinals, the Dream turned to that strength to help cap a comeback in their 2019 opener.

Jessica Breland scored 17 points, including a late go-ahead three-point play, and Atlanta held Dallas without a field goal in the final 2 minutes as the Dream rallied to beat the Wings 76-72 on Friday night.

Center Elizabeth Williams said Atlanta coach Nicki Collen expects defense to make decisive stands.

"At the end of games she trusts us to get stops," Williams said.

The Dream led the WNBA in field goal percentage defense (42.3) last season. The Wings made 26 of 74 shots (35.1 percent).

Dallas led 55-47 before Atlanta won the final period, 29-17.

"It was ugly but I think we did what we do and that's battle," Collen said. "... It took a little while to get everyone on the same page, but we just don't give up."

Renee Montgomery had 15 points for the Dream.

Allisha Gray had 14 points off the bench to lead Dallas. Rookie Arike Ogunbowale had 12 points. Another rookie, Brooke McCarty-Williams, had eight points and eight assists.

Imani McGee-Stafford's layup gave Dallas a 67-65 lead. McCarty-Williams' steal set up Gray's layup, stretching the lead to four points. Another steal by Gray set up her free throws for a 71-65 advantage.

Following a 3-pointer by Montgomery, Brittney Sykes made two of three free throws and grabbed the rebound on the miss to set up Breland's go-ahead three-point play with 1:17 remaining.

The Dream led 20–14 before the Wings scored the final five points of the first period to launch a 15–0 run for a 29–20 advantage. McGee–Stafford's offensive rebound and basket capped the run.

Sykes' 3-pointer snapped Atlanta's scoring drought, but Dallas led 39-34 at halftime. Every Wings player in uniform scored in the half, including five players off the bench.

Marie Guilich scored all of her six points in the final quarter to help Atlanta rally. Tiffany Hayes, a first-team all-WNBA selection last year, scored only five points while making only two of eight shots from the field. She missed each of her four 3-point attempts.

JUNE 15, 2019

ARLINGTON, Texas (AP) Arike Ogunbowale scored 17 points, Allisha Gray added 16 points and the Dallas Wings got their first win of the season with a 71–61 victory over the Atlanta Dream on Saturday night.

The Wings (1–5) took control with a 17–4 run to lead 45–40 on Gray's driving layup with 1:47 left in the third quarter. The Dream (1–5) cut the deficit to 45–44 by the end of the period, but Dallas pushed its lead to 65–53 and held on for the final three minutes.

Elizabeth Williams had 16 points, Tiffany Hayes scored 15 and Alex Bentley added 11 for Atlanta. The Dream led for most of the first half with their largest lead of the game at 32–23.

After the game, the stat crew made a correction and took a blocked shot away from Atlanta's Jessica Breland. With the official scoring change, Breland finished with one block and has 299 career blocks.

Atlanta has lost five in a row since beating Dallas 76-72 in the season opener for both teams.

AUGUST 25, 2019

ARLINGTON, Texas (AP) Tiffany Hayes scored 23 points to help Atlanta hold off the Dallas Wings 77–73 on Sunday for the Dream's first back-to-back road wins of the season.

Elizabeth Williams gave the Dream (7–22) the lead for good on a putback with 1:05 left and Hayes scored a driving layup with 21 seconds left to make it 75–71.

Isabelle Harrison cut the deficit back to two for the Wings (9–20), but Hayes made two free throws with 10 seconds left to secure the win.

Atlanta started to pull away with a run late in the second quarter and extended the lead to 60-40 late in the third.

Dallas erased the deficit when Arike Ogunbowale's free throw with 2:01 left tied it at 71.

Ogunbowale scored 29 points for the Wings, her sixth straight 20-point game and 13th of the season, which passed Odyssey Sims' franchise record for most 20-point games in a season by a Dallas rookie.

Williams returned after missing the last two games for personal reasons.




