

She's Baaaaaack

Veteran forward Angel McCoughtry will play against the Dream for the first time in her 11-year career Wednesday night. McCoughtry was drafted to Atlanta with the No. 1 overall selection in 2009 and became the face of the franchise for years. She became an unrestricted free agent following the 2019 season and signed with Las Vegas on February 10, 2020.

2020 WNBA Season at IMG Academy

The league's 24th season will take place in Bradenton, Florida at IMG Academy, the Official Home of the 2020 WNBA season, and will include a 22-game schedule for each of its 12 teams. The Dream's regular season will run from July 26 to September 11, and will be followed by a standard-format Playoff series.

Opening Night

In the Dream's 105-95 season-opening win over Dallas, Atlanta showed off a fast new offensive pace to emerge as the top-scoring team through the first games. Monique Billings led all scorers over the weekend, finishing with 30 points and 13 rebounds for her second career double-double. All five starters for the Dream scored in double digits and combined for 100 points for the first time in franchise history and just the sixth time in WNBA history.

Returning Players

Dream veteran center Elizabeth Williams and forward Monique Billings are the only returning players on Atlanta's roster this season. They are joined by 11 new players, three of which are rookies. Blake Dietrick played for the Dream in 2018 and returned for training camp in 2019, but was waived by Atlanta and picked up by Seattle for the 2019 season.

Only one other team* in WNBA history has returned two or fewer players from the previous season – Phoenix in 2017 (returned Diana Taurasi and Brittney Griner).

Career Milestones

Elizabeth Williams needs 22 blocks to surpass Erika de Souza (281) as Atlanta's career blocks leader, and only needs 5 rebounds to reach 1,000 in her career.

Hollywood

Chennedy Carter started off her 2020 Rookie of the Year campaign with a bang last Sunday night, scoring 18 points with 8 assists with only two turnovers. She led all rookies in scoring and ranked second in the league in assists (behind Courtney Vandersloot's 11)

The standout was one of the most dynamic scorers in NCAA D-I during her three-year career at Texas A&M. She scored at least 26 points in all six of her career NCAA Tournament games, leading the Aggies to the NCAA Sweet 16 twice. Among players with at least five NCAA Tournament games played, Carter ranks third in scoring average at 31.0 points per game, trailing only Elena Delle Donne [34.4 PPG at Delaware] and Sheryl Swoopes [31.7 PPG at Texas Tech].

The AAPF and the #SayHerName Campaign

Launched in December 2014 by the African American Policy Forum (AAPF) and Center for Intersectionality and Social Policy Studies (CISPS), the #SayHerName campaign brings awareness to the often invisible names and stories of Black women and girls who have been victimized by racist police violence, and provides support to their families.

Black women and girls as young as 7 and as old as 93 have been killed by the police, though we rarely hear their names. Knowing their names is a necessary but not a sufficient condition for lifting up their stories which in turn provides a much clearer view of the wide-ranging circumstances that make Black women's bodies disproportionately subject to police violence. To lift up their stories, and illuminate police violence against Black women, we need to know who they are, how they lived, and why they suffered at the hands of police.¹

Elizabeth Williams

With Dream veteran Tiffany Hayes choosing to forego the 2020 season, Elizabeth Williams becomes the Dream's current active leader in nearly every statistical category with 1,371 points, 927 rebounds, 259 blocks, 134 games played and 4,076 minutes in a Dream uniform.

In her first game of the season, Williams shot a perfect 7-of-7 from the field and 3-of-3 from the charity stripe. She tied the franchise record for most field goals without a miss

Connecticut South

Shekinna Stricklen and Courtney Williams, who helped Connecticut reach the WNBA Finals last season, are new to Atlanta but not to Nicki Collen, who spent 2015–17 as an assistant with the Sun. Last year, Stricklen ranked third in the league in made threes [76] and Williams was 20th in scoring [13.2 ppg].

#SayHerName and the Transgender Community

In 2020, at least 22 transgender or gender non-conforming people have been fatally shot or killed by other violent means ("at least" is used here in acknoledgement of unreported or misreported cases). The Human Rights Campaign's annual reports have found that fatal violence disproportionately affects transgender women of color – particularly Black transgender women – and that the intersections of racism, sexism, homophobia, biphobia, transphobia and unchecked access to guns conspire to deprive them of employment, housing, healthcare and other necessities.²

Lady Vols

Glory Johnson and Shekinna Stricklen will appear on the same roster for the first time in their professional careers this summer. The last time the duo played together was at the University of Tennessee, when they led the Lady Vols to back-to-back Elite Eight appearances and three-straight SEC Tournament Championships under legendary coach Pat Summitt. Stricklen and Johnson were selected second and fourth overall, respectively, in the 2012 WNBA Draft.

Laney Finding Her Place

After spending the first four years of her career with Indiana and Chicago, guard Betnijah (buh-NIGH-jah) Laney is finding her place

with Atlanta. Originally brought in for her defensive mindset, she has proven herself to be a strong offensive player and was a standout for the Dream during training camp. In her first game in red and gray, Laney started and put up a career-high 19 points with 3 assists and grabbed two defensive boards.

Erica McCall Reps the A in the Bubble

The Dream picked up McCall after being granted an emergency hardship waiver during training camp. As the younger sister of Connecticut forward Dewanna Bonner, the pair is the only sister duo playing in the league this season.

Offseason Moves

Atlanta had the most active offseason of any team in the league this year, aquiring 10 new players through Free Agency, the Draft and trades prior to coming to Florida. The Dream traded for Courtney Williams from Connecticut and Kalani Brown from Los Angeles, along with a talented crop of Free Agents that included Glory Johnson and Shekinna Stricklen. Life Expectancy of Trans Women of Color

According to a study by the Inter-American Commission on Human Rights, in the Americas*, trans women of color have a life expectancy of 30–35 years of age. According to the data collected, approximately 80% of trans persons killed were 35 years of age or younger. Violence against trans persons, particularly trans women, is the result of a combination of factors: exclusion, discrimination and violence within the family, schools, and society at large; lack of recognition of their gender identity; involvement in occupations that puts them at a higher risk for violence; and high criminalization of trans women. ³

Dream Draft Four in 2020 WNBA Draft

The Dream drafted four players in the 2020 WNBA Draft, headlined by guard Chennedy Carter out of Texas A&M with the No. 4 overall selection. Collen picked Texas Tech forward Brittany Brewer with the No. 17 overall selection (second round) – Carter and Brewer both signed contracts with the team for the 2020 season.

Collen also selected Oregon State guard Mikayla Pivec and Clemson forward Kobi Thornton with the No. 25 and 27 picks (third round), respectively.

A Bold New Era

Atlanta implemented a rebrand prior to the 2020 season, unveiling new logos and colors for the first time since its inaugural season (2008). The Dream also has new uniforms, a new mascot and had been slated for a new home – the Gateway Center Arena @ College Park. The new primary logo reflects a combination of icons related to Atlanta's history. Centered around a basketball, the rising phoenix symbolizes the city's rise from the ashes of the Civil War to become a world city, and a shooting star ties the Dream to its original roots.

Are We Done Talking About Breonna Taylor?

Of course not. On the day of this game, it will have been 138 days since she was murdered in her own apartment. The officers responsible for her death have not been arrested. Moving forward, players will have the option to keep her name on the back of their jerseys. Ten Dream players will still be wearing her name plate for the duration of the season.

RECENT MEETINGS WITH ACES

JUNE 6, 2019

ATLANTA (AP) Liz Cambage had 15 points, seven rebounds and three assists in her first start for Las Vegas and the Aces beat the Atlanta Dream 92–69 on Thursday night.

Las Vegas scored the first 10 points of the game, held a 19-2 lead, and it was 25-13 at the end of the first quarter after holding Atlanta to 5-of-15 shooting. The Aces led 49-25 at halftime, paced by A'ja Wilson's 11 points, and Dearica Hamby's steal and fast-break layup made it 81-51 early in the fourth quarter.

Hamby finished with 15 points and eight rebounds, Kayla McBride added 13 points, Wilson scored 11 and Kelsey Plum had 10 points, seven rebounds and four assists for Las Vegas (2-2). Rookie Jackie Young had a game-high eight assists.

Brittney Sykes led Atlanta (1–3) with 15 points and Elizabeth Williams reached 800 career rebounds. Tiffany Hayes was held to seven points on 3–of–14 shooting. Atlanta, which swept the three–game series last season, has dropped three in a row for the first time since the 2017 season.

AUGUST 13, 2019

LAS VEGAS (AP) Dearica Hamby had 23 points and 16 rebounds, Liz Cambage added 18 points, 10 rebounds and six assists and the Las Vegas Aces held off the Atlanta Dream 94-90 on Tuesday night.

Kelsey Plum sank a pull-up jumper from the free-throw line with 15.8 seconds left to give Las Vegas a 92-88 lead. Tiffany Hayes was off on a long 3-pointer at the other end and Kayla McBride sealed it at the line.

McBride scored 21 points, with five 3-pointers, for Las Vegas (17-9). Jackie Young chipped in with 17 points and Plum was the lone Aces starter not in double figures with nine.

Atlanta (5–20) has lost 10 straight games, its longest streak since a 4–30 season in 2010.

Jessica Breland scored 18 points and Marie Gulich had her first career double-double with 15 points and 12 rebounds for Atlanta. Hayes was just 2 of 12 from the field for 10 points after setting a career high with 34 on Saturday at Indiana.

SEPTEMBER 5, 2019

ATLANTA (AP) Elizabeth Williams had 20 points, eight rebounds and a career-high eight blocks in the Atlanta Dream's 78-74 victory over the Las Vegas Aces on Thursday night.

The Aces (20-13) gave the Chicago Sky (19-13) a chance to overtake them for the No. 4 seed in the playoffs and a first-round bye. Las Vegas holds the tiebreaker over Chicago and can still wrap up the fourth seed with a win in the season finale Sunday at Phoenix.

A'ja Wilson scored 19 points for Las Vegas.

The Dream (8-25) took their first lead at 63-62 on Marie Gulich's layup with 5:10 left. Renee Montgomery's 3-pointer made it 68-62 and capped a 9-0 run for Atlanta.

Wilson made a pair of free throws to pull the Aces to 76-74 with 23 seconds left, but Alex Bentley answered with a pair of free throws four seconds later and Las Vegas missed its final three shots.

Atlanta avoided securing the worst record in the WNBA this season, although that distinction still looms with either a loss to the New York Liberty in the season finale or a Liberty victory over Indiana on Friday.


