Last Game: Sunday, July 14 – Indiana 81, Minnesota 74

Aliyah Boston scored 17 points – including the go-ahead basket with 2:54 to play – and added 16 rebounds and four blocks to lift Indiana past the Lynx, 81-74, on Sunday afternoon at Target Center. Boston netted nine points and seven boards in the first quarter, which ended with the Fever on top, 20-19, but Bridget Carleton's 3-pointer capped a 10-2 start to the second that put Minnesota in front by seven. Indiana pulled even by halftime on a late basket by Caitlin Clark, and Kelsey Mitchell's layup at the 4:15 mark of the third period put the Fever in front, 50-48. However, the Lynx countered with 10 unanswered points and grabbed their largest lead on a pair of Courtney Williams free throws with 1:05 left in the quarter. Treys by Clark, Mitchell and Katie Lou Samuelson in the opening two minutes of the fourth knotted the score at 63-63. Neither team led by more than three until consecutive layups by Boston put the Fever ahead 75-71 at the 2:02 mark, and Indiana hit six free throws to complete its comeback. Mitchell's 21 points paced the Fever while Alanna Smith led Minnesota with 18 points, eight rebounds and four steals.

Previous Game: Friday, July 12 – Seattle 91, Minnesota 63

Nneka Ogumike scored a season-high 26 points and Skylar Diggins-Smith added 10 points and a career-best 12 assists as Seattle routed the Lynx, 91-63, on Friday night at Climate Pledge Arena. The Storm spotted Minnesota a 9-2 start, but nine points from Jewell Loyd and a late Sami Whitcomb trey gave Seattle a 25-22 lead after one quarter. The Lynx went scoreless for the first five minutes of the second while Seattle rattled off 11 unanswered points, and the margin reached 18 on a Diggins-Smith 3-pointer before Kayla McBride helped Minnesota whittle that to 50-37 by halftime. Three long-range strikes by McBride pulled the Lynx to within 10 midway through the third period, but the comeback stalled and Minnesota managed just 11 points over the game's final 14 minutes. A Joyner Holmes 3-pointer in the final minute set the final margin at 28, tying Seattle's largest win ever against the Lynx and allowing the Storm to avoid a sweep of the teams' four-game season series. Loyd and Whitcomb tallied 14 points apiece for Seattle while McBride's 27 points led Minnesota, whose 30.6% accuracy from the field was its lowest in 13 years.

Last season was the second time the Dream defeated Minnesota twice, having gone 2-1 in 2018. Atlanta's win last May 23 was its first at Target Center since notching an 85-68 triumph on July 2, 2019.

First Meeting: Kayla McBride made her first nine shots en route to a 31-point effort and Napheesa Collier added 20 points, eight rebounds and seven assists to lift the Lynx past Atlanta, 92-79, on May 26 at Gateway Center Arena. Alanna Smith netted 17 points and five assists for Minnesota. Rhyne Howard led the Dream with 23 points and six steals while Tina Charles put in 14 points.

Second Meeting: Napheesa Collier scored 16 points and Dorka Juhász (10 points, 11 rebounds) posted her first double-double of the year as the Lynx downed Atlanta, 68-55, on June 19 at Target Center. Bridget Carleton ended with 14 points for Minnesota, which overcame a 35.5 percent night from the field, while Tina Charles led the Dream with 14 points and 10 rebounds.

LYNX TRAX: Indiana rallied for a 81-74 victory over Minnesota on Sunday at Target Center; the attendance (18,978) was the largest regular season figure for a home game in Lynx history and trails only the 19,423 for Game 5 of the 2016 WNBA Finals vs. Los Angeles (Oct. 20, 2016) overall... Minnesota has now dropped five of its last eight starts and slips to 16-8 overall, four games behind New York (20-4) atop the WNBA standings... Seattle avoided a sweep of its four-game season series vs. the Lynx by rolling to a 91-63 win last Friday at Climate Pledge Arena... Minnesota kicked off its final road trip before the Olympic break with last Tuesday's 82-67 victory at Los Angeles, and snapped its first two-game losing streak of 2024 by edging Washington, 74-67, on July 6... The Lynx saw their seven-game home winning streak halted with the 78-73 loss to Connecticut on July 4; it was their longest run of success at Target Center since winning nine in a row in 2021... Minnesota opened July with a 76-67 loss at New York on July 2, having capped a 9-2 June with the 70-62 win at Chicago on June 30... Dallas ended Minnesota's six-game winning streak by rallying for a 94-88 victory on June 27... The Lynx claimed the 2024 Commissioner's Cup with a 94-89 win over New York on June 25 at UBS Arena... Minnesota concluded a 4-0 homestand with the 73-60 victory over Phoenix on June 22; the Lynx began the homestand with an 81-76 win over Los Angeles on June 14 and followed with victories over Dallas (90-78 on June 17) and Atlanta (68-55 on June 19)... The Lynx posted a 100-86 win at Las Vegas on June 11, and beat Seattle for the third time this season with the 83-64 verdict on June 9 at Target Center...

CHART TOPPERS: Atlanta's 28.8% effort from the floor on June 19 marked the 16th time in team history the Lynx have posted a sub-30% defensive night... Overall, the Lynx have held 10 of 24 opponents below 40%; Minnesota leads the WNBA in both defensive FG pct (40.1%) and Defensive Rating (93.3)... On the flipside, the Lynx were held to 30.6% last Friday at Seattle, their lowest percentage since shooting 27.5% vs. San Antonio on Aug. 4, 2011; they shot a season-best 55.2% at Las Vegas on June 11... Minnesota leads the WNBA in three-point accuracy (38.5%) and ranks 2nd in three-pointers made per game (9.79)... Minnesota wrapped up May with a 95-71 triumph over Phoenix on May 31, its largest winning margin since a 102-71 win vs. Las Vegas on July 3, 2022... Connecticut dealt the Lynx their first loss of 2024 on May 23, rallying for an 83-82 OT win... Minnesota began the season with a pair of victories over Seattle, 83-70 on May 14 at Climate Pledge Arena and 102-93 in double-OT on May 17 at Target Center...

MARGINAL INFORMATION: Last Friday's 28-point loss at Seattle was Minnesota's largest of the season and matched its largest ever vs. the Storm (90-62 on June 19, 2009 at KeyArena)... The Lynx made up a 10-point deficit to beat Chicago on June 30, their third win this season in games they've trailed by 10+ at some point (June 9 vs. Seattle; June 14 vs. Los Angeles); last year, Minnesota posted four double-digit comeback victories... Conversely, the Lynx' largest lead at Chicago was nine; it's one of only six games this year in which they haven't built a lead of 10+... Overall, Minnesota has won a WNBA-best 12 games by double-figure spreads in 2024 (Las Vegas 12, New York 12, Seattle 12)... Last season, they finished 4-14 in games decided by 10+; only Phoenix (24) and Seattle (15) suffered more double-digit losses... Minnesota enjoyed a 10-game winning streak a year ago in games decided by six points or fewer...

LYNX TRAX: Minnesota capped its 25th anniversary season in the WNBA with a return to the postseason, having missed out last year for the first time since 2010... The Lynx finished at 19-21 in the league's longest season, tied for 5th place with Atlanta and Washington; the Dream claimed the #5 seed while Minnesota settled for #6 after dropping its final two contests (Sept. 8 at Chicago and Sept. 10 at Indiana)... The Lynx wrapped up the Target Center portion of their regular season with the 86-73 triumph over Phoenix on Sept. 3, securing its 14th trip all-time to the WNBA Playoffs... The Lynx hit Atlanta with an 18-2 scoring run (spanning the end of the 4th quarter and the start of overtime) to pull out a 91-85 victory on Sept. 1 at Target Center... It's their second overtime win of the season, having beaten Seattle 99-97 on June 29 at Climate Pledge Arena...
