

TERESA WEATHERSPOON

Head Coach

Teresa Weatherspoon was selected No. 10 overall to New York in the WNBA's inaugural draft in 1997. She then spent a legendary eight-year career in the league, with her first seven seasons with New York (1997-2003) and her final year with Los Angeles (2004). She led the Liberty to the first-ever WNBA Finals in 1997 and 1999. Weatherspoon is No. 2 on the Liberty's All-Time Minutes played list (6,842), No. 1 All-Time Assists (1,306) and No. 1 in All-Time Steals (453) for the franchise. She returned to New York as the Liberty's first Director of Player and Franchise Development from 2015 to 2019.

In 2016, she was amed to the league's Top-20 best and most influential players in WNBA history. She is a five-time WNBA All-Star Starter (1999-2003), four-time All-WNBA Second Team (1997-2000), two-time WNBA Defensive Player of the Year (1997-98) — the first WNBA player ever to be

named DPOY in 1997 — league leader in Assists and Steals in 1997, WNBA All-Decade Team Honorable Mention (2006) and named to WNBA Top-15 players (2011).

Weatherspoon has been inducted to five Hall of Fames, including the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame (2019), Texas Sports Hall of Fame (2020), Louisiana Sports Hall of Fame (2010), Women's Basketball Hall of Fame (2010) and the Louisiana Tech Athletic Hall of Fame (1995).

Internationally, the Pineland, Texas native is also a two-time Olympic Games medalist, earning Gold in 1988 and Bronze in 1992 with Team USA. She also spent six years of playing career in Italy, where she was named a six-time Italian League All-Star (1989-94) and a two-time Russian League Champion (1995-96).

Weatherspoon joins the Sky with well over a decade of coaching experience. She began her coaching career in 2007 as head coach of the Westchester Phantoms of the American Basketball Association.

In 2008, she joined the coaching staff at Louisiana Tech and was promoted to head coach in 2009. She led her alma mater to back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances (2010-11), a Western Athletic Conference Tournament title (2010) and a WAC regular-season championship (2009, 2011). The two-time All-American tallied a 99-71 record as the Lady Techsters' head coach.

She also led Louisiana Tech to an NCAA Championship as a player in 1988 and is the No. 1 All-Time Assist leader in school history (958). Her No. 11 jersey is now retired at LA Tech. On September 20, 2023, Weatherspoon was one of six LA Tech legends to be honored with a statue at the school.

Most recently, the New Orleans Pelicans hired Weatherspoon as a two-way player development coach in 2019 and stayed on the coaching staff as an assistant until 2023.

SYDNEY JOHNSON

Assistant Coach

The Sky hired Sydney Johnson as assistant coach on Feb. 26. Johnson served as the head coach of USA Basketball's 3×3 U23 World Cup Team in September 2023. He was also head coach of the 3×3 Men's U23 Nations League Team in July 2023. Johnson began his coaching career as an assistant at Georgetown University from 2004-07, where he helped the Hoyas to their first Final Four in 22 years in 2007. In 2007, Johnson led Princeton to an Ivy League Championship. Johnson took over as head coach of Fairfield University in 2011. He recorded the most postseason appearances in school history (four), most postseason victories in school history (three) and tied for the second-most winning seasons (five) in program history.



TAMERA YOUNG

Assistant Coach

The Sky hired Tamera "Ty" Young as assistant coach on April 17. Young returns to the organization after playing nine years in Chicago out of a storied 12-year career in the league as the third-longest tenured player in Sky history. She ranks in the top 10 in Sky history in 10 overall categories: 250 games played (No. 3), 211 steals (No. 4), 1,815 total points (No. 9), 340 assists (No. 7), 286 offensive rebounds (No. 3), 678 defensive rebounds (No. 4), 964 total rebounds (No. 4), 340 assists (No. 7), 724 field goals made (No. 7) and 41.1% field goal percentage (No. 9). Young was previously drafted No. 8 overall by Atlanta in the 2008 WNBA Draft and then played for Las Vegas from 2018-19 after nine seasons in Chicago from 2009-17 and retired from playing in 2019.



DAVID SIMON

Assistant Coach

David Simon rejoins the Sky staff from last season as a player development coach. With over 10 years as a professional player, Simon brings a high level of expertise back to the organization. He entered the NBA draft in 2006 after playing four seasons at Purdue Fort Wayne from 2001-05. He ranks first in Mastodon history in blocked shots with 141, second in blocked shots per game with 1.7 and fourth in total rebounds with 623. The Vernon Hills, Illinois native was the first player in program history to participate in an NBA Summer League and was inducted into the IPFW Athletics Hall of Fame in 2016. He averaged 14.9 points, 7.5 rebounds and 1.4 over four seasons. Simon then excelled professionally overseas in South Korea, Japan, Kazakhstan, France and more.

2024 WNBA AWARDS CHENNEDY CARTER

MOST IMPROVED PLAYER, ALL-WNBA

- Chennedy Carter is averaging 17.5 points per game this season, ranking 14th in the league among all players
- She began the season on the bench and quickly became a contender for the Sixth Player of the Year Award, averaging a league-high 12.6 points off the bench. Her 12.6 points off the bench are still the highest average among players with 10 or more appearances off the bench
- She was inserted into the starting lineup on June 16 and has averaged 20.7 points, 3.9 rebounds and 3.7 assists on 47.7% shooting from the field. Her 20.7 points as a starter would rank fourth in the entire league if expanded across the entire season
- Two of her top three scoring outings have come this season. She scored 33 points against the Seattle Storm on July 5 and then dropped 34 points on a career-high 14 field goals made against the Las Vegas Aces on July 16
- She ranks second in the WNBA in fast break points per game with 3.6 and ranks seventh among all players in points in the paint per game with 10.3.
 No other pure guard appears in the top 15 in that metric and she's the only non-big in the top seventh
- Recorded 11 straight games with 15 or more points from June to July 11, the second-longest streak in Chicago Sky history
- Her 48.7% field goal percentage is her career high mark from the floor
- She's recording the second-best per-minute production of her career, averaging 24.2 points per 36 minutes.

- She recorded 11 assists (including a careerhigh six on Aug. 28) in a two-game stretch to close out August
- Joining Angel Reese, they're the only rookie duo in WNBA history to record multiple instances of notching double-doubles in the same game

CLASS IS IN SESSION

The Sky drafted Kamilla Cardoso and Angel Reese in the 2024 draft, selecting Cardoso with the third overall pick in the draft and using the seventh overall pick to take Reese. Two of the most prolific collegiate players of all time, Cardoso and Reese were the first Sky first rounders since 2021. Cardoso was the Sky's first lottery pick since 2019, when the team selected Katie Lou Samuelson with the fourth overall pick. This is also the first time since 2018 where the Sky made two first round picks — the last time the Sky did so, they selected Diamond DeShields and Gabby Williams. Cardoso scored six points, four rebounds, an assist, a steal and two blocks in the Sky's first preseason game on May 3 against Minnesota. Reese scored 13 points, nine rebounds, an assist, two steals and a block in the same game before recording 13 points, five rebounds and two steals in the Sky's second preseason game against New York. Reese started in the season opener and became the first Sky first rounder to start in their debut since DeShields and Gabby Williams in 2018. Cardoso made her debut on 6/1 against Indiana and immediately contributed, pouring in 11 points.

With Reese going for 20 points and 10 rebounds and Cardoso going for 10 points and nine rebounds on June 12 against Connecticut, the duo became the first rookie pair to each have 10+ points and 9+ rebounds in the same game since Chiney Ogwumike and Alyssa Thomas both did so for the Sun in 2014.

Reese recorded five offensive rebounds on June 16 against Indiana while Cardoso recorded six; Reese and Cardoso became the first Sky rookies in franchise history to each have 5+ offensive rebounds in the same game and are the first rookies to do so for any team since Joyner Holmes and Jocelyn Willougby in 2020 for New York.

With Reese's 18 rebounds and Kamilla Cardoso's career-high 11 rebounds, the duo became the pair of rookie teammates to have multiple games in which they record 10+ rebounds in the same game since Tina Charles and Kelsey Griffin did it for the Connecticut Sun in 2010. Reese and Cardoso also both recorded 10+ rebounds on June 16 against Indiana.

Reese and Cardoso each recorded career highs in scoring on June 23 against Indiana, with Reese scoring 25 to go along with 16 rebounds while Cardoso recorded 16 points and 10 rebounds. Reese and Cardoso become the first rookie duo since 1998 to record double-doubles in multiple games.

Reese and Kamilla Cardoso are the fifth pair of teammates in WNBA history to each have at least 15 points and 10 rebounds while shooting 65.0% or better in the same game. It's the first time a pair of rookies have done so.

With Cardoso going for 15 points and 14 rebounds and Reese going for 14 and 11 on Aug. 17, it marks the 12th time two rookie teammates each had double-doubles in the same game. Cardoso and Reese account for the last four.

BUILDING ON CAREER YEARS

Elizabeth Williams and Dana Evans return to the Sky after having career years with the franchise in 2023 and helping lead Chicago to the postseason.

Williams averaged career highs of 2.5 assists and 1.3 steals per game to go along with 9.8 points, 5.8 rebounds and 1.5 blocks per game. Her points average was her most since 2020, her rebounds and her blocks were her most since 2019. The epitome of consistency for the Sky, Williams appeared in and started in all 40 regular season games with the Sky, along with both postseason games. Alongside Courtney Williams, Elizabeth Williams' 42 total games played in 2023 are the most in franchise history (the WNBA expanded its number of games in a regular season to 40 in 2023). Due to her 2.8 stocks per game (blocks + steals) and her overall perimeter and interior defense, Williams earned a nod to the WNBA's All-Defensive Second Team. Matched her career high in steals with five on May 18 against Dallas.

Williams became the first player to record multiple games with 10+ points, 10+ rebounds, 4+ steals and 4+ blocks in a single season after recording 17 points, 11 boards, four blocks and four steals against Los Angeles on May 30. She shot 66.7% from the field in that game, becoming the first player in league history to record that statline while shooting 65.0% of better from the field. Her 11 rebounds were a season high. She passed Taj McWilliams-Franklin for 10th on the WNBA's all-time blocks list during the 6/4 game against New York.

Evans improved in her third season with the Sky, posting career highs in minutes, points, rebounds, assists, steals and blocks. She averaged 9.0 points and 3.0 assists off the bench for the Sky in 2023, finishing third in Sixth Player of the Year voting. She was tremendous in the Sky's two playoff games against the eventual-champion Las Vegas Aces, recording 14.5 points, 3.5 assists and 1.5 steals in two games. At 25 years old, Evans is in good position to once again top her career-high averages for the third straight season. Started consecutive games for the first time in her career in the first two games of the season against Dallas (May 15, May 18). She recorded a season-high 15 points on May 30 against the Sparks along with stealing the ball a career-high five times. Made a career-high 10 free throws (all of her attempts) on June 20 against Dallas. She reached 100 career made threes on July 2 against Atlanta.

DON'T CALL IT A COMEBACK

Isabelle Harrison signed with the Sky in 2023 but didn't appear in a regular season game after suffering an injury. With an offseason of recovery under her belt, Harrison is primed to help the Sky reach the playoffs again in 2024. A six-year WNBA veteran, Harrison holds career averages of 8.6 points and 4.9 rebounds. This offseason, she suited up for Athletes Unlimited and ended up with a 40-point performance in one of her games. Harrison made her Chicago Sky debut on May 28 against the Storm, recording two points and five rebounds in 10 minutes.

Against Washington on June 6, Harrison recorded 14 points and seven rebounds off the bench, both of which were 2024 highs. She recorded 10 points in the third quarter. Harrison reached 1,500 career points on June 30 against Minnesota. Harrison pulled down a season-high 12 rebounds for her first double-double of the season on July 11 against New York. Her 11 defensive rebounds in that game were a career high. She had her most productive game of the season in her first start in a Sky uniform on Sept. 8, scoring a season-high 21 points along with nine rebounds.

Chennedy Carter signed with the Sky on a training camp deal in 2024 after not appearing in a WNBA game during the 2023 season. A former fourth overall pick, Carter is a young, high-scoring player who finished second in Rookie of the Year voting in 2020 after averaging 17.4 points and 3.4 assists. Carter played in both China and Turkey during the WNBA offseason, putting up a 50-point game in China. She made the Sky's opening day roster after a pair of preseason appearances. Scored a then-season high 12 points on May 18 against Dallas and matched that on May 23. Also pulled down six rebounds on May 23 against New York, which matched her career high. Had eight straight games with at least 11 points from May 18 to June 6, including a then-season high 14 against the Sparks on May 30.

Set new season highs after leading the Sky in both assists (six) and points (19) against the Fever on June 1. Carter is the WNBA's leading scorer off the bench, averaging 12.6 points through her first 13 games off the bench. Put up a new season-high 25 points against Washington on June 6. Made her first start in a Sky uniform on June 16 against Indiana, scoring 18 points to go along with four assists. Scored 23 points on June 23 against Indiana.

Since becoming a starter, Carter is averaging 20.7 points and 3.7 assists per game. Carter's 17.5 points per game are also her most since her Rookie of the Year season in 2020. She recorded a then-season-high 26 points on July 2 against Atlanta. Carter then topped that with a second straight game with a season high on July 5 against Seattle, putting up 33 points on 11 made field goals (a career high). Her 33 points were the most by a Storm opponent this season. Ranks second in the WNBA with 3.6 fast break points per game. Ranks seventh in the WNBA in points in the paint with 10.2. Reached 1,000 career points on July 11 against New York. Had 11 straight games with 15+ points, the second-longest streak in Sky history Scored another season high with 34 points on July 16 against the Aces, recording team highs of 14 field goals made on 24 attempts.

OUTSIDE HELP

In the 2024 offseason, the Sky signed Lindsay Allen before acquiring Michaela Onyenwere and Brianna Turner via trade.

Allen is a six-year WNBA veteran with lead guard skills who can help take the Sky to the next level in 2024. In her last two seasons (with Minnesota), Allen averaged 6.3 points and 4.4 assists across 38 games and 20 starts. She played with Botas in Turkey during the WNBA offseason, stuffing the stat sheet with near-triple-double performances on a nightly basis. Led the Sky in assists on May 28 with four alongside Dana Evans. Recorded a season-high 10 points on June 14 against Washington. Made her first start in a Sky uniform on June 16 against the Fever. Recorded four assists on June 20 against Dallas. Recorded a season-high seven assists on June 23 against Indiana. Matched her season high of seven assists on July 11.

Allen stuffed the stat sheet on June 27 against the Aces, scoring 10 points, five assists, four rebounds, an assist and a block while playing a season-high 34 minutes. She followed that up with season highs of 13 points, six rebounds, seven assists and two blocks on June 30 against Minnesota. She recorded a season-high 16 points to go along with six assists on Aug. 17 against Los Angeles. Reached 100 career steals on Aug. 23 at Connecticut. She again tied her season high of 16 points on Aug. 25 against Las Vegas. She then snapped that season high with 19 points on Aug. 30, scoring 16 in the first half alone. In her last six games, Allen averaged 12.5 points and 4.8 assists on 52.7% shooting from the field, 40.0% shooting from three and an 86.7% clip from the free-throw line from Aug. 17-30.

Onyenwere is just a handful of seasons removed from winning WNBA Rookie of the Year in 2021 and she had her best statistical season at age 23 with Phoenix last season. Acquired alongside Turner in the trade that sent Kahleah Copper to the Mercury, Onyenwere made her first start in a Sky uniform on May 23, filling in for Diamond DeShields. She scored 13 points and five rebounds in the game. Started the 6/1 game against Indiana. Recorded a season-high 14 points on July 13 against New York, making 85.7% of her field goal attempts. Started her third game of the year on 8/15. Onyenwere set season highs in points (15), field goals made (six), field goals attempted (13), three-pointers made (3) and three-pointers attempted (5) on Aug. 25 against Las Vegas. Matched her season high with 15 points on Aug. 28 against Washington.

Onyenwere scored or tied a season high in points for the third straight game on Aug. 30, scoring 20 points while making a season-high eight field goals. She is averaging 13.1 points and 3.4 rebounds on 47.7% shooting from the field and 45.5% from three (3.3 attempts) in her last 10 games. Reached 100 career assists on Aug. 30 against Indiana. She reached 1,000 career points on Sept. 15 against Phoenix.

Turner joins the Sky after spending the first five seasons of her career in Phoenix. A defensive technician, Turner holds two career appearances on the WNBA's All-Defensive First Team (2020 and 2021). She holds career averages of 5.2 points, 7.0 rebounds, 1.3 blocks and 0.9 steals per game while connecting on 58.2% of her shots from the field. Turner scored her first point in a Sky uniform on May 23 against New York.

HOMECOMING

Diamond DeShields returns to Chicago after spending the first four years of her career with the Sky. She was an All-Star in 2019 after averaging 16.2 points, 5.5 rebounds, 2.4 assists and 1.3 steals. For her efforts, she was also named to the All-WNBA Second Team. Two years later, DeShields helped lead the Sky to their first-ever championship in 2021, averaging 11.3 points in the regular season and 5.5 points during the playoff run. She was traded to Phoenix in 2022, missed the 2023 season with an injury, and then signed with the Sky in 2024. For the first time since 2021, DeShields is suiting up for Chicago and returning as a veteran leader after entering the franchise as the No. 3 overall pick in 2018. She scored 12 points off the bench on Aug. 28 against Washington. DeShields reached 2,000 career points on Aug. 30 against Indiana.

TRADE DEADLINE REINFORCEMENTS

The Sky traded Marina Mabrey to Connecticut in exchange for **Moriah Jefferson** and **Rachel Banham** on July 17. The move brings in two veteran guards who can fill positions of need for the Sky.

Banham recently recorded a season-high 24 points on eight made three-pointers on July 14 against Phoenix. A career 36.9% shooter from beyond the arc, Banham can help the Sky in that regard. Banham made her first start in a Sky uniform on Aug. 15 against Phoenix. Banham scored a Sky season-high 14 points on Aug. 17 against Los Angeles. Tied her Sky season high with 14 points on Aug. 30 against Indiana. She hit a Sky season-high five three-pointers en route to 17 points against Phoenix on Sept. 15. She also recorded season highs of five rebounds and seven assists in that game while having knocked down all five of her threes in the first half.

Jefferson has been limited to nine games this season but recorded some of the best numbers of her career in 2023 with Phoenix. She averaged 10.5 points and 3.6 assists in 39 games last season, starting in 36. Like Banham, she is a strong shooter, posting a career 39.6% clip from deep.

REESE'S REBOUNDING RECORDS

Angel Reese's 15 offensive rebounds through three the first three games of the season tied for second in WNBA history for most through a player's first three games. She is tied with Natalie Williams (1999) and ranks one behind Yolanda Griffith (16 in 1999).

She is the sixth player all time and the first since A'ja Wilson in 2018 to begin the season with three straight games with 10 or more points and eight or more rebounds.

She is the only rookie this season to score 10 or more points in each of their first five games and is the first rookie in Sky history to score in double figures in each of her first five games.

Her 26 rebounds are the most in a three-game stretch to begin a career in Sky history.

She ranks first in the WNBA offensive rebounds per game (5.1) and first in total rebounds per game (13.1).

Reese had three or more offensive rebounds in each of her first nine career games, which ranks second all time in consecutive games with 3+ offensive boards to begin a career. She ranks behind just Yolanda Griffith (17) for such games.

Reese recorded her first double-double of her career on May 28 against the Storm, putting up 11 points and 12 rebounds. She surpassed her previous career high of nine rebounds in the first half by pulling down 10 in the first two quarters. She finished the game one behind the Sky's all-time single-game rookie rebound record.

Reese's 13 rebounds against the Fever on June 1 tied the Sky's all-time rookie record.

Reese recorded a 13-point, 10-rebound double-double against the Liberty on June 4.

Reese recorded career highs of 16 points, three assists and five steals against Washington on June 6. She also had 11 rebounds, which was good for her second straight double-double.

After doing so on June 6, Reese is the first rookie to record 15+ points, 10+ rebounds and 5+ steals in a game since Candace Parker did so in 2008.

Reese is the fifth rookie all time to record three consecutive games with five or more offensive rebounds and five or more defensive rebounds, joining Yolanda Griffith (1999), Cheryl Ford (2003), Tina Charles (2010) and Satou Sabally (2020).



REESE'S REBOUNDING RECORDS (CONT.)

Reese recorded 13 points, 13 rebounds and five steals on June 8 against Atlanta. Became the third rookie all time with 13+ points, 13+ rebounds and 5+ steals in a game, joining Tamika Catchings and Candace Parker. Reese is the third player in WNBA history with 10+ points, 10+ rebounds and 5+ steals in back-to-back games, joining Catchings (2002) and Erlana Larkins (2014). Reese is the fourth Sky player to have three or more consecutive double-doubles in franchise history. Sylvia Fowles did so 12 times, Elena Delle Donne did so twice and Candace Parker did so once.

Reese scored a career-high 20 points to go along with 10 rebounds, her fifth double-double of her career, on June 12 against Connecticut.

Reese is the fourth first-year player in league history to have 13+ points and 10+ rebounds in four consecutive games, joining Yolanda Griffith, Tamika Catchings and Tina Charles.

Reese recorded a then-career-high 14 rebounds on June 14 against Washington, the Sky's all-time rookie record.

Reese's 10+ rebounds in seven straight games broke Cindy Brown and Tina Charles' record for the all-time record for consecutive 10+ rebound games in a player's first WNBA season. She's now at 28 straight such games, which is the record for consecutive games with 10+ rebounds for all players in any season of their career. She also had three straight games with 20 or more rebounds from Aug. 18-25.

Reese recorded a then-career-high 18 rebounds to go along with 16 points, three assists and two steals on June 20 against Dallas.

Reese's seven consecutive double-double following the June 20 game against Dallas broke the WNBA's all-time record for consecutive games with a double-double by a first-year player (Previous: six such games).

Reese is tied for third-most double-doubles in a player's first 14 games with eight double-doubles in her first 14.

Reese joined Yolanda Griffith and Tina Charles as the only first-year WNBA players to put up 15+ points, 10+ defensive rebounds and 8+ offensive rebounds in a single game all time.

Reese is the sixth first-year player to record 16+ points and 18+ rebounds in a game, becoming the first since Teaira McCowan did so in 2019.

Reese's 45 rebounds in a three-game stretch are the most by a WNBA rookie since McCowan had 46 through three games in 2019.

Reese is the first rookie with 25+ points and 15+ rebounds since A'ja Wilson in 2018.

Reese is the only rookie in Sky history to record 20+ points and 15+ rebounds in the same game.

Reese was just one of three players in WNBA history to record eight or more consecutive double-doubles.

Reese passed Candace Parker (2015 - 9) for the most consecutive double-doubles in a single season with 10 after the June 30 game against the Lynx.

As of Sept. 11, Reese leads the WNBA in rebounds per game with 13.1.

Reese recorded a career-high 19 rebounds on July 2 against Atlanta, the then-most in a single game by any WNBA player this season. Her previous high of 18 was tied for league lead in a single game.

Reese's 12 double-doubles this season were the eighth-most in WNBA history in a player's first season. Tina Charles (2010) has the record with 22 double-doubles.

July 2 against Atlanta marked Reese's fourth game this season with 16 or more rebounds, which leads the league.

Reese was named a 2024 WNBA All-Star on July 2, becoming the first Sky rookie since Elena Delle Donne (2013) to do so and fourth ever in franchise history after Courtney Vandersloot (2011) and Candice Dupree (2006).

Reese was named the WNBA Rookie of the Month for the month of June 2024 on July 2 after averaging 14.5 points and 13.2 rebounds in 11 games during June. She recorded 10+ rebounds in every game in June.

Reese recorded a career-high 27 points in a July 5 win against Seattle.

Angel Reese passed Latasha Byears (87 offensive rebounds in rookie season) and Tamika Catchings (91 offensive rebounds in rookie season) for 12th, then 11th, respectively, on the WNBA's all-time rookie offensive rebounds list.

Reese is the fourth first-year player with 25+ points, 10+ rebounds, 2+ made three-pointers and 2+ blocks in a game, joining Lisa Leslie, Tamika Catchings and Satou Sabally.

Reese passed Candace Parker for the most consecutive double-doubles in WNBA history with 13 straight after the July 7 game against Seattle. Parker previously recorded 12 straight spanning the 2009-10 seasons. Reese's all-time streak stands at 15 consecutive games.

Reese passed Glory Johnson (95 offensive rebounds in rookie season) for 10th on the WNBA's rookie offensive rebounds list on July 7.

Reese then passed Tamika Raymond (96) for ninth on WNBA's rookie offensive rebounds list with 97 on July 7.

With two offensive rebounds on July 10 against Atlanta, Reese passed Nneka Ogwumike (98 career offensive rebounds) and tied Cheryl Ford (99 offensive rebounds) for seventh on the WNBA's all-time rookie offensive rebounds list.

Reese passed Chiney Ogwumike (264 rebounds in rookie season) for 11th, passed Lisa Leslie (266 rebounds in rookie season) for 10th and tied Tamika Catchings for ninth on the all-time rookie rebounds list with 276 after the July 13 matchup against New York.

Reese passed Teaira McCowan (108 offensive rebounds in rookie season) for sixth Natalie Williams (109 offensive rebounds in rookie season) for fifth on the all-time rookie offensive rebounds list with 110 after the July 13 matchup against New York.

Reese passed Sylvia Fowles (117 in single season) for most offensive rebounds in a single season in Sky franchise history after notching 120 through 25 games played.

With her 15 rebounds on Aug. 15, Angel Reese tied Cindy Brown (301) for eighth on the all-time rookie rebounds list. She passed Brown on Aug. 17.

Reese reached 18 double-doubles on Aug. 15, moving her past Yolanda Griffith and Candace Parker (17 each) for second-most ever by a first-year player.

Reese passed Teaira McCowan (305 rebounds in rookie season) for seventh on the WNBA's all-time rookie rebounds list with 312 on Aug. 17.

Reese passed Chiney Ogwumike (122 offensive rebounds in rookie season) for fourth on the WNBA's all-time rookie offensive rebounds list.

Reese then tied Aliyah Boston (125 offensive rebounds in rookie season) for third on the all-time rookie offensive rebounds list in the same game.

Reese passed Tamika Catchings (184 defensive rebounds in rookie season) for 12th on the WNBA's all-time rookie defensive rebounds list on Aug. 17.

Reese passed Margo Dydek (186 defensive rebounds in rookie season) for 11th on the all-time rookie defensive rebounds list with 187 in that same game.

Reese recorded a 19-point, 20-rebound double-double on Aug. 18 against Phoenix, marking her first career 20-rebound game. Her 20 rebounds tied A'ja Wilson for most rebounds in a game in 2024. She recorded a career-high 10 offensive rebounds in the same game, the most in the WNBA this season.

Reese passed Candace Parker (313 rebounds in rookie season) for sixth on the WNBA's all-time rookie rebounds list.

Reese also passed Breanna Stewart (317 rebounds in rookie season) for fifth on the rookie rebounds list.

Reese then passed Yolanda Griffith (329 rebounds in rookie season) for fourth on the rookie rebounds list with 332 after the Aug. 18 game.

Reese passed Yolanda Griffith (188 defensive rebounds in rookie season) for 10th on the WNBA's all-time rookie defensive rebounds list on Aug. 18.

Reese had just the fourth 10 defensive rebound/10 offensive rebound game in WNBA history on Aug. 18, joining Yolanda Griffith, Natalie Williams and Cheryl Ford, marking the first time the line has been recorded in over 20 years.

Reese became the first player in WNBA history to record consecutive 20-rebound games after doing so on Aug. 18 and Aug. 23.

Outside of Reese, the only other player to record multiple games with 20 or more rebounds as a rookie is Tina Charles.

Reese is also the first rookie in either the NBA or the WNBA with consecutive 20-rebound games since Shaquille O'Neal did so in 1993.

Reese passed Cheryl Ford (334 rebounds in rookie season) for third on the WNBA's all-time rookie rebounds list on Aug. 23.

Reese then passed Aliyah Boston (335 rebounds in rookie season) for second on the all-time rookie rebounds list with 352 after Aug. 23.

Reese passed A'ja Wilson (198 defensive rebounds in rookie season) for eighth on the WNBA's all-time rookie defensive rebounds list.

Reese also passed Lisa Leslie (203 defensive rebounds in rookie season) for seventh on the rookie defensive rebounds list.

Reese then tied Aliyah Boston for sixth on the rookie defensive rebounds list with 210 on Aug. 23. She passed Boston on Aug. 25.

Reese passed Yolanda Griffith (141 offensive rebounds in rookie season) for first on the rookie offensive rebounds list with 142 on Aug. 23.

Reese set the WNBA league high and tied the Sky's single-game rebounding record with a career-high 22 boards on Aug. 25 against Las Vegas. She recorded her third straight 20+ rebound game after becoming the first player in WNBA history to record back-to-back such games. She was two away from tying the all-time single-game record.

Reese became the first player in WNBA history with multiple games of 10+ offensive rebounds and 10+ defensive rebounds in the same game.

Reese passed Candace Parker (229 defensive rebounds in rookie season) for fifth on the WNBA's all-time rookie defensive rebounds list

Reese then passed Cindy Brown (231 defensive rebounds in rookie season) for fourth on the all-time rookie defensive rebounds list with 232 after Wednesday's game

Reese passed Tina Charles (398 rebounds in her rookie season) for first on the WNBA all-time rookie rebounds list with 399 rebounds this season on Aug. 30.

With 26 double-doubles this season, Reese has the most double-doubles in a single season by a rookie.

Reese passed Cheryl Ford (235 defensive rebounds in rookie season) for third on the WNBA's all-time rookie defensive rebounds list with 241 defensive rebounds this season on Aug. 30.

Reese passed Sylvia Fowles (404 - 2018) for first on the all-time single season rebounding list, breaking the record for most rebounds in a season with 446 and counting. Reese also passed Yolanda Griffith (162 - 2001) for first on the all-time single season offensive boards list with 172. Moved into second on the all-time rookie defensive rebounds list on Sept. 6 with 274.

Reese is the fastest player to 400 rebounds in WNBA history, taking just 32 games to achieve the feat.

Tied Elena Delle Donne for sixth on the Sky's all-time franchise offensive rebounding list with 172 offensive boards.

CARDOSO'S CLUTCH ROOKIE SEASON

In Kamilla Cardoso's first game against the Fever on June 1, she recorded 11 points and six rebounds in 18 minutes off the bench. She was a plus-11 in a one-point loss. Cardoso started her first career game on June 8 against Atlanta, recording a career-high 13 points.

She then recorded her first career double-double on June 16 against the Fever, going for 10 points and 10 rebounds.

Cardoso recorded a career-high 11 rebounds on June 20 against Dallas.

She then recorded a then-career-high four blocks on July 7 against Seattle. Cardoso topped that career high with five blocks on Aug. 25 against Las Vegas.

Cardoso matched her career high of 11 rebounds on July 10 against Atlanta.

Cardoso had a career game on Aug. 17 against Los Angeles, going for 15 points (one shy of career high) and 14 rebounds (career high).

Cardoso scored a career-high 18 points on Aug. 23 against Connecticut.

The No. 3 overall pick stuffed the stat sheet on Aug. 28 against Washington, recording 10 points, 11 rebounds, three blocks and a career-high six assists.

Cardoso scored a career-high 22 points on Sept. 1 against Minnesota. Since the All-Star/Olympic break, Cardoso averaged 12.8 points, 8.5 rebounds, 2.5 assists and 1.8 blocks while shooting 58.7% from the field and 80.9% from the free throw line in her first 13 games coming out of the All-Star/Olympic break.

She reached 300 career points on Sept. 13 against Minnesota.



THE QUEST FOR TITLE NO. 2

The Sky hired head coach **Teresa Weatherspoon** this offseason, a WNBA legend making her league head coaching debut. Chicago also hired **Sydney Johnson** and **Tamera "Ty" Young** as assistant coaches. Johnson and Young are making their WNBA coaching debuts.

Weatherspoon earned her first career WNBA head coaching win on May 18 against Dallas.

Chicago made the playoffs for the fifth straight season in 2023 and are looking to make it a sixth straight this season.

SKY IN THE RECORD BOOKS

Through 38 games, the Sky rank first in the league with 11.1 offensive rebounds per game. Additionally, the Sky rank first in total rebounds per game (37.1). Their 37.1 rebounds per game would rank 17th all time in rebounds per game for a single season.

Chicago's 13 blocks on May 18 against Dallas matched the all-time franchise high, which had previously been set twice. The Sky last reached 13 blocks in 2015.

The Sky's 15 steals on May 18 were two shy of tying the all-time franchise record of 17 set in 2006. Their 15 steals also surpassed their 2023 single game season high of 14 (set on May 19, 2023 against Minnesota).

Elizabeth Williams passed Tangela Smith (658) for 21st on the WNBA's all time offensive rebounds list with 663 after the May 18 game against Dallas.

Diamond DeShields passed Elena Delle Donne (386) for sixth on the Sky's all-time three-point attempts list with 387 on May 28 against the Storm.

SKY-DREAM CONNECTIONS

PLAYER PRO CONNECTIONS

The Sky drafted Atlanta forward Cheyenne Parker-Tyus with the No. 5 overall pick in the 2015 WNBA draft. She played for the Sky for six seasons from 2015-20. In 166 career games with the Sky (25 starts), she averaged 7.0 points and 4.5 rebounds while shooting 49.8% from the field and 35.6% from three.

Chennedy Carter was drafted with the No. 4 overall pick in the 2020 draft by the Dream. She averaged 17.4 points and 3.4 assists in her rookie year, being named runner-up for the WNBA's Rookie of the Year award. In total, she played 27 games (all starts) with the Dream from 2020-21, averaging 16.1 points and 3.4 assists.

Elizabeth Williams played with the Dream from 2016-21, averaging 9.4 points, 6.4 rebounds and 1.8 blocks in 187 games (186 starts) during her Atlanta career. Williams was named the WNBA's Most Improved Player in 2016 after jumping to 11.9 points, 8.1 rebounds and 2.3 blocks from 3.3 points, 3.2 rebounds and 0.9 blocks the year prior (her rookie season). She was an All-Star for the team in 2017 after averaging 10.4 points, 7.2 rebounds and 2.0 blocks. She is the franchise's all-time leader in blocks (331), blocks per game (1.8) and holds Atlanta's single-season records of blocks (79 in 2016) and blocks per game (2.3 in 2016).

Kaela Davis appeared in two games with the Dream in 2020.

PLAYER COLLEGIATE/HOMETOWN CONNECTIONS

Atlanta's Nia Coffey played college basketball at Northwestern, located in Evanston, Illinois.

Kamilla Cardoso and Atlanta's Laeticia Amihere and Allisha Gray all played at South Carolina. Cardoso and Amihere played together from 2021-23, helping lead South Carolina to a combined 71-3 record over two years. In 2021-22, Cardoso and Amihere helped lead South Carolina to a national title and in 2022-23, they secured a Final Four appearance.

Michaela Onyenwere and Atlanta's Jordin Canada played together at UCLA in 2017-18. Together, they helped lead UCLA to a 27-8 record and an Elite Eight appearance.

COACHING PRO CONNECTIONS

Sky assistant coach Tamera "Ty" Young was drafted with the No. 8 overall pick in the 2008 draft by the Dream. She averaged 7.3 points and 4.2 rebounds during her rookie season before being traded to the Sky in 2009, where she played for nine years. She suited up again for the Dream in 2017, averaging 4.5 points and 2.3 rebounds.
