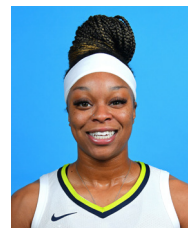

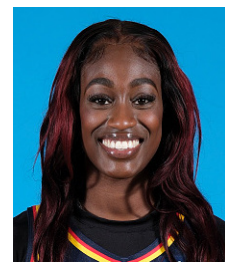

In the teams' first meeting on opening night of the 2024 season, **Layshia Clarendon** recorded their first career triple-double (11 PTS, 10 AST, 10 REB, 2 STL). **Kia Nurse** (23 PTS, 5 3PM), **Dearica Hamby** (20 PTS, 14 REB, 3 AST, 2 STL) and **Cameron Brink** (11 PTS, 4 AST, 2 BLK) each provided key contributions. The Sparks assisted on 24 of their 28 made field goals in the contest.

In the second meeting, rookies Brink (7-for-13 FG) and **Rickeia Jackson** (6-for-13 FG) each poured in 16 points, with the Stanford alumna adding seven rebounds and two steals. **Aari McDonald** contributed 14 points and five assists, draining four triples. L.A. led Atlanta by a point entering the final quarter.

Julie Allemand (suspended for the WNBA season for ankle rehab) - Missed Olympics (Team Belgium) with an injury

Dearica Hamby - Led Team USA 3x3 to a **bronze** medal, winning six of seven games after starting 0-3...Hamby shot 55.7% on one-pointers and 40.0% from deep

Kia Nurse - Started all three games for Team Canada, averaging 7.7 points

Stephanie Talbot - Won **bronze** for Team Australia 5x5 with a key block in the bronze medal game...Set record for most single-game assists for a Team Australia player at the Olympics with 10 vs. Nigeria...Recorded the second-most combined rebounds and assists in a game in women's Olympic history with 22 (12 REB & 10 AST) vs. Nigeria...Averaged 6.4 points, 8.4 rebounds, 5.4 assists, 1.6 steals and 0.6 blocks over five games (played 11 minutes before exiting with an injury against Team USA)

Li Yueru - Started all three games for Team China, averaging 17.7 (63.0 FG%) points and 11.1 rebounds (4.3 ORPG)...Tied a women's Olympic record for offensive rebounds in a game with 10...Second now all-time in China women's Olympic history in points in a game after scoring 31 vs. Spain...Third now all-time in China women's Olympic history in rebounds in a game after securing 15 vs. Spain.

Head Coach Curt Miller - Won a **gold** medal as a Team USA 5x5 scout

Captain, Our Captain

Head Coach Curt Miller currently stands 11th all-time in WNBA wins with an impressive 164-133 (.554) record, ranking third among active head coaches. Miller, in his second season as Sparks head coach, helmed the Connecticut Sun for seven seasons prior. The Pennsylvania native is a two-time WNBA Coach of the Year (2017 & 2021) and was named WNBA Executive of the Year in 2017. Miller served as women's basketball head coach at Bowling Green (2001-12) and Indiana (2012-14), also patrolling the Sparks bench as an assistant coach in 2015. In May 2024, Coach Miller was inducted into the Mid-American Conference (MAC) Hall of Fame.

DEARICA HAMBY

All-WNBA - This season, Hamby has been one of the most complete, consistent and durable players in the league, ranking second in defensive rebounds per game, tied for third in double-doubles, fourth in rebounds per contest, seventh in field-goal percentage, tied for seventh in steals per game and 11th in scoring average, while averaging the fifth-most minutes per game.

WNBA Most Improved Player of the Year - Hamby has been mentioned in multiple media outlets as a leader for this award for much of this season, as her averages across the board have made astronomical jumps.

WNBA All-Rookie Team - The fourth overall draft pick has routinely been listed as the most efficient rookie this season, mentioned in the same breath as Rookie of the Year frontrunners **Caitlin Clark** and **Angel Reese**. On Aug. 25, Jackson became the **first WNBA rookie ever to post 25 points with six made triples and three blocks in a single game**. Azurá Stevens Signs Contract Extension

The Los Angeles Sparks announced Thursday that WNBA Champion **Azurá Stevens** has signed a one-year contract extension with the Sparks. The 6-foot-6 forward was first acquired by the Sparks in 2023 free agency when she signed a multi-year contract with LA. Since then, she's averaged 10.9 points and 6.0 rebounds per contest, starting 39 of the 46 games in which she's played. With her next block, Stevens will claim sole possession of 10th on the Sparks' all-time blocks list.

Stephanie Talbot Signs Contract Extension

The Los Angeles Sparks announced Thursday that forward **Stephanie Talbot** has signed a contract extension through the 2025 season. In her first season with the Sparks, she has averaged 4.2 points, 3.0 rebounds and 2.3 assists. On Aug. 23, the Aussie secured her 500th career rebound and is closing in on 900 points (894) and 300 assists (293).

Rickea Rising

Rickea Jackson has contributed double-figure scoring totals in nine consecutive games (and 13 of her past 14 contests) and is the only rookie shooting 45.0% or higher and averaging over 10.0 points per game. She is the first Sparks rookie with multiple 20-point outings since **Nneka Ogumike** in 2012.

Jackson had a career game Aug. 25 at Dallas, pouring in a career-high 25 points, while making six triples and nine field goals and swatting three shots, all career highs. She also matched her career high in steals and assists with two and four, respectively. The Michigander is averaging 17.2 points across her past nine games.

Through Aug. 30, the fourth overall pick in the 2024 WNBA Draft ranks second among qualifying rookies in three-point percentage (12th leaguewide) and free-throw percentage, third in field-goal percentage (23rd leaguewide), scoring average and minutes per game, and fifth in rebounds per contest.

Crystal Dangerfield Inks Rest-of-Season Hardship Contract

On Friday, the Sparks announced that guard **Crystal Dangerfield** has signed a rest-of-season hardship contract with the team. The 2020 Rookie of the Year averaged 8.1 points, 2.8 assists and 2.1 rebounds over five WNBA seasons with the Lynx, Fever, Liberty, Wings and Dream and made three Final Four appearances with UConn. Dangerfield debuted for the Sparks July 7 vs. the Mercury. Dangerfield posted season highs in points (11), assists (6), field goals made (4) and three-pointers made (3) Saturday Aug. 17 the Sky in her first start of the season.

Odyssey Sims Signs Third 7-Day Hardship Contract

On Aug. 31, the Sparks signed guard **Odyssey Sims** to a third 7-day hardship contract. At the time of her original signing on Aug. 17, in 11 WNBA seasons with five organizations, including the Sparks, the 5-foot-8 guard had averaged 11.3 points, 3.7 assists and 2.5 rebounds, while shooting 39.5 percent from the field and 27.8 percent from distance.

This season, Sims started seven of nine games for the Dallas Wings, averaging 17.2 points, 5.6 assists and 1.7 steals, while shooting 53.5% from the field and 50.0% from beyond the arc. Sims played two seasons for Los Angeles (2017-18), averaging 8.9 points and 3.1 assists over 65 games (38 starts). In 2019, she was named an All-Star and earned All-WNBA Second Team honors. Sims was selected second overall by the Tulsa Shock in the 2014 WNBA Draft out of Baylor University, where she won the 2012 NCAA Championship and was named 2014 Big 12 Player of the Year. In 2014, the guard finished runner-up for the Rookie of the Year Award.

On Aug. 25, Sims made history, becoming the **first WNBA player to record at least 25 points and nine assists off the bench** in a game. She also is the only Spark to post a 25-point, 10-assist performance after scoring 26 points (8-11 FG, 1-1 3PT, 9-11 FT) and dishing 10 dimes against her former team in Dallas.
